#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

With Steve Ma leaving the district and Eric Dill replacing his position, various accounts and organizations need to be updated authorizing appropriate personnel as representatives and to sign on various documents including financial accounts, developer fees and agreements, eligibility determination and applications, and liability claims. The following is a summary of recommended authorized representatives and signatures.

The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) requires a resolution be adopted to update authorized signers on all documents associated with applications for eligibility and funding. The resolution further authorizes the support of eligibility determination.

As a member of the San Diego County Schools Risk Management Joint Powers Authority (JPA) and the Fringe Benefits Consortium (FBC), the Board is required to appoint a representative and alternate representative for both the JPA and FBC. The attached JPA resolution identifies Eric R. Dill, Associate Superintendent of Business Services, as the representative, and Terry King, Associate Superintendent of Human Resources, as the alternate representative.

Delores L. Perley, as a part of her assignment, will oversee the Revolving Cash Fund. The attached resolution changes the custodian of the Revolving Cash Fund to Delores L. Perley.

A signature is needed to replace Steve Ma on the Revolving Cash Fund Prepayment (Instant Money) account. The attached resolution changes the authorized persons to sign on the Revolving Cash Fund-Prepayment (Instant Money Account), to Eric R. Dill or Christina M. Bennett or Delores L. Perley.

The Government Code allows the Board to adopt a resolution delegating the authority to allow, reject, compromise, or settle claims against the District up to \$50,000 per claim. #### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

In 1979, voters approved a constitutional limit on government spending at every level in the state, including the school districts. The original proposition stated that no agency's expenditures can exceed its Gann limit, which is adjusted annually for changes in population and the lesser of either the national Consumer Price Index (CPI) or California's per capita personal income.

Two subsequent constitutional amendments diluted the original intent of the Gann limit. Proposition 111 changed the inflation index for the Gann limit calculation, effectively raising the limit and Proposition 98 provided a minimum funding guarantee for education.

Article XIIIB of the California Constitution requires each school district to establish an actual and a projected appropriation limit, commonly referred to as "Gann Limit". The San Dieguito Union High School district does not exceed the calculated limit for 2009-2010 nor is it expected that the District will exceed the limit in 2010-2011.

The actual Gann Limit calculation is part of the Standardized Account Code Structure (SACS) forms and is included in the full SACS report. The relevant pages detailing the Gann Limit from the full SACS report are attached.

Adoption of this resolution is required annually and should be considered routine in nature.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Board adopt the attached resolution establishing the Gann Limit, which identifies the estimated appropriations limit for the current year and the actual appropriations for the preceding year.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Board of Trustees was presented with a draft of a revision to Board Policy 3400 – Management of District Assets along with a new Administrative Regulation at the August 10, 2010 Board Meeting. The purpose of the revised policy and new regulation is to incorporate additional language relating to internal controls, fraud hotlines, a code of ethics, and prevention of waste, fraud, and abuse of public funds.

There were no comments following the first read of either the policy or the regulation. Staff is therefore bringing back this revised Board Policy and Administrative Regulation for approval.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Board approve the Revision of Board Policy #3400 and #3400/AR-1, "Management of District Assets", as shown in the attached supplement.

#### **FUNDING SOURCE:**

Not applicable.

#### MANAGEMENT OF DISTRICT ASSETS/ACCOUNTS

The Governing Board recognizes its fiduciary responsibility to effectively manage and safeguard the district's assets and resources in order to help achieve the district's goals for student learning. The Superintendent or designee shall establish and maintain an accurate, efficient financial management system that enhances the district's ability to meet its fiscal obligations, produces reliable financial reports, and complies with laws, regulations, policies, and procedures. He/she shall ensure that the district's accounting system provides ongoing internal controls and meets generally accepted accounting standards.

#### INTERNAL CONTROLS/FRAUD PREVENTION

The Board expects Board members, employees, consultants, vendors, contractors, and other parties maintaining a business relationship with the district to act with integrity and due diligence in dealings involving the district's assets and fiscal resources.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop internal controls which aid in the prevention and detection of fraud, financial impropriety, or irregularity within the district. These internal controls may include, but are not limited to, segregating employee duties relating to authorization, custody of assets, and recording or reporting of transactions; providing detailed, written job descriptions explaining the segregation of functions; adopting an integrated financial system; conducting background checks on business office employees; and requiring continuous in-service training for business office staff on the importance of fraud prevention.

All employees shall be alert for any indication of fraud, financial impropriety, or irregularity within their area of responsibility. Any employee who suspects fraud, impropriety, or irregularity shall immediately report those suspicions to his/her immediate supervisor and/or the Superintendent or designee. In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall establish a method for employees and outside persons to anonymously report any suspected instances of fraud, impropriety, or irregularity.

The Superintendent or designee shall have primary responsibility for any necessary investigations of suspected fraud, impropriety, or irregularity, in coordination with legal counsel, the district's auditors, law enforcement agencies, or other governmental entities, as appropriate.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide regular reports to the Board on the status of the district's internal control procedures and recommend any necessary revisions to related Board policies or administrative regulations.

#### **ACCOUNTING SYSTEMS**

General and budgetary accounting is prescribed by the Education Code and must be in accordance with the California State Department of Education Accounting Manual. The Superintendent or designee shall provide ongoing internal accounting controls and a means for the accounting of income and expenditures as outlined in the adopted budget.

#### **AUDITS**

All accounts shall be audited annually as prescribed by the Education Code. The audit examination shall be conducted in accordance with the requirements of the State Controller. By April 1 of each year, the Board shall provide for an audit of all district funds, any other funds which are administered pursuant to a joint powers agreement, and attendance procedures. To conduct the audit, the Board shall select a certified public accountant or public accountant licensed by the State Board of Accountancy. The audit shall identify all expenditures by source of funds and shall contain the following:

- 1. A statement that the audit was conducted pursuant to standards and procedures established in the audit guides developed by the State Controller.
- 2. A summary of audit exceptions and management recommendations. The Superintendent or designee shall establish a timetable for the completion and review of the audit within the deadlines established by law.

The Superintendent or designee shall file the report of the audit with the County Superintendent of Schools, the Department of Education, and the State Controller no later than December 15.

#### **ENCUMBERING**

In order to have a clear picture of the district's financial condition readily available and as current as possible, the Superintendent or designee shall see that funds are encumbered in the district accounting records immediately after an expenditure is committed for subsequent payment.

#### **OBLIGATION OF CONTRACT**

The district's obligation of contract, with regard to financial transactions, shall commence when the Board adopts a resolution formally adopting, approving, or entering into any financial transaction, or when the Superintendent or designee enters into any financial transaction under authority specified by law or Board policy.

With the mutual consent of the Board or Superintendent or designee and the other party or parties to the financial transaction, a different time may be set for the commencement of the obligation. The Board shall not adopt any resolution which would be binding until the terms of the transaction are sufficiently definite.

#### MANAGEMENT OF DISTRICT ASSETS/ACCOUNTS

#### **ACCOUNTS**

The district's accounting system shall fully comply with the definitions, instructions and procedures set forth in the California Department of Education School Accounting Manual.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that funds are encumbered in the district accounting records immediately after an expenditure is committed for subsequent payment.

#### FRAUD, WASTE, & ABUSE - PREVENTION AND INVESTIGATION

All employees shall be alert for any indication of fraud, financial impropriety, or irregularity within their area of responsibility. Any employee who suspects fraud, impropriety, or irregularity shall immediately report those suspicions to his/her immediate supervisor and/or the Superintendent or designee. Employees and outside persons may also anonymously report any suspected instances of fraud, impropriety, or irregularity by calling the WeTip 24/7 hotline at 1-800-78-CRIME (1-800-782-7463).

Fraud, financial improprieties or irregularities include but are not limited to:

- 1. Forgery or unauthorized alteration of any document or account belonging to the district
- 2. Forgery or unauthorized alteration of a check, bank draft or any other financial document
- 3. Misappropriation of funds, securities, supplies or other assets
- 4. Impropriety in the handling of money or reporting of financial transactions
- 5. Profiteering as a result of insider knowledge of district information or activities
- 6. Disclosing confidential and/or proprietary information to outside parties
- 7. Disclosing investment activities engaged in or contemplated by the district
- 8. Accepting or seeking anything of material value from contractors, vendors or persons providing services or materials to the district
- 9. Destroying, removing or inappropriately using of records, furniture, fixtures or equipment
- 10. Failing to provide financial records to authorized state or local entities
- 11. Use of district position or resources for personal or private gain.
- 12. Directing purchases of goods or services to organizations in which the employee has a financial interest.
- 13. Accepting gifts, services, travel, entertainment, jobs for immediate family members, or other special considerations that may give the appearance that the benefit could improperly influence district decisions.
- 14. Hiring, assigning, promoting, or supervising family members or in a way that creates the appearance of impropriety.
- 15. Failing to disclose waste, fraud, abuse, and corruption to the appropriate personnel at the

district.

- 16. Using authority to intimidate, threaten, or retaliate against a person to attempt to interfere with the disclosure of potentially improper governmental activity.
- 17. Any other dishonest or fraudulent act

The Superintendent or designee shall investigate reports of waste, fraud or abuse in a manner that protects the confidentiality of the parties and the facts. All employees involved in the investigation shall be advised to keep information about the investigation confidential.

If an investigation substantiates the occurrence of a fraudulent activity, the Superintendent or designee shall issue a report to appropriate personnel and to the Governing Board. The final disposition of the matter and any decision to file a criminal complaint or refer the matter to the appropriate law enforcement and/or regulatory agency for independent investigation shall be made in consultation with legal counsel. The result of the investigation shall not be disclosed to or discussed with anyone other than those individuals with a legitimate need to know.

#### HIGH SCHOOL SELECTION

#### **SELECTION PROCEDURES**

The 2010-11 2011-12 high school selection filing period begins on January 11, 2010 January 10, 2011 and closes on February 8, 2010 February 7, 2011. Students may not switch school choices after the application deadline. No applications will be accepted for the non-boundary schools (SDA/CCA) after the February 8, 2010 February 7, 2011 deadline. Students who are selected to attend the non-boundary schools (SDA/CCA) are required to enroll at SDA/CCA by March 26, 2010 April 1, 2011. Students who fail to enroll by March 26, 2010 April 1, 2011, will lose their lottery position. A public lottery will be held on February 25, 2010 February 24, 2011, if needed necessary.

#### Canyon Crest Academy and San Dieguito High School Academy

A. All 9 12 students who reside within district boundaries are eligible to apply for admission to Canyon Crest Academy or San Dieguito High School Academy. High School Selection shall be submitted online-prior to the designated deadline. If applications for admission exceed the program-capacity of the schools, a random, unbiased process will be followed to select those applicants eligible to enroll. Those not selected to enroll initially will be placed on a waiting list by grade level in the priority order in which they were selected. A waiting list will remain in force for one full year or until exhausted.

#### **B.** Enrollment Procedures

- 1. District resident sibling-applicants of current year 9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup>-grade students are eligible to attend either CCA or SDA as long as their sibling is currently at that academy. A CCA incoming sibling has no priority at SDA and vice versa. Eligible siblings must participate in the high school selection process and meet the enrollment deadline.
- 2. Enrollment in a school of choice shall be determined by lottery from the eligible applicant pool, and a waiting list shall be established to indicate the order in which students may be accepted as openings occur. Late applications shall not be added to the waiting list.

#### **CURRENT 8TH GRADE DISTRICT STUDENTS & RANCHO SANTA FE MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS**

All District students and Rancho Santa Fe Middle School students entering grade 9 must declare the high school they wish to attend by submitting their online high school selection, during the high school selection filing period.

#### **CURRENT 9TH, 10TH & 11TH GRADE DISTRICT STUDENTS**

Students currently in grades 9, 10, or 11 who wish to remain at the same high school for the following school year, DO NOT need to participate in the selection process. They will automatically be enrolled in their current school for next year. Only students who wish to change schools, must declare the high school they wish to attend by submitting their online

high school selection, during high school selection filing period. Students who do not participate in the selection process are not eligible to attend Canyon Crest Academy or San Dieguito Academy.

#### STUDENTS NEW TO DISTRICT & PRIVATE SCHOOL / LIVING WITHIN SDUHSD BOUNDARIES

All 8th – 11th grade students living within the SDUHSD boundaries who are currently enrolled in private school, home school or another public school or and will be new to the district in the Fall of the next school year, must declare the high school they wish to attend by submitting their online high school selection, during the high school selection filing period. Students who are moving into the district are only eligible to attend an academy school if their primary residence is within the district boundaries prior to the close of the high school selection filing period.

#### **SUNSET/NORTH COAST STUDENTS**

Sunset and North Coast students who wish to return to the Academy school they came from may do so by scheduling an appointment with the school principal. Sunset and North Coast students who wish to leave SS/NC and attend a school that is different from the high school they previously attended, must participate in the online high school selection process during the high school selection filing period.

#### **CURRENT 8TH GRADE STUDENTS FROM OAK CREST & DIEGUENO MIDDLE SCHOOLS**

La Costa Canyon High School attendance area students (incoming 9th grade students from Oak Crest and Diegueno Middle Schools) may select from one of four (4) choices: La Costa Canyon High School, Torrey Pines High School, Canyon Crest Academy, or San Dieguito Academy. However, students in the La Costa Canyon attendance area must complete an intra-district transfer application to attend Torrey Pines. Intra-district applications must be turned in to the SDUHSD District Office by the designated date.

#### **CURRENT 8TH GRADE STUDENTS FROM CARMEL VALLEY & EARL WARREN MIDDLE SCHOOLS**

Torrey Pines High School attendance area students (incoming 9th grade students from Earl Warren and Carmel Valley Middle Schools) may select from one of (4) choices: Torrey Pines High School, La Costa Canyon High School, Canyon Crest Academy, or San Dieguito Academy. However, students in the Torrey Pines High School attendance area must complete an intra-district transfer application to attend La Costa Canyon High School. Intra-district applications must be turned in to the SDUHSD District Office by the designated date.

**STUDENTS** 5116.1 / AR-2

#### **CURRENT CCA & SDA STUDENTS**

Current CCA and SDA students may apply to the other academy without losing their spot at the academy they are currently attending, by selecting online, the other academy school, prior to the end of the high school selection filing period and meeting the enrollment/course selection deadline.

#### STUDENTS NOT RETURNING

Students who will not be returning to SDUHSD in the Fall of the next school year, must go online and mark, "Not Returning – I am going to...", and identify where they will be attending in the Fall of the next school year.

#### **MEDICAL LEAVE**

Students who leave an academy school for medical reasons may return to that same school providing they have met with the site administration beforehand and have agreed to the leave in writing. In order to return, the student must have his/her primary residence within the district boundaries.

#### FOREIGN EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

Students who leave an academy school to attend an approved foreign exchange program may return providing:

- The program is an approved foreign exchange program (CIF listing). The student leaving must provide written proof of the approved program.
- They return to the same academy school they left. If they wish to change schools they must participate in the high school selection process during the regular filing period.
- The student has his/her primary residence within the district boundaries.

Host families of a Foreign Exchange Student that is part of an approved foreign exchange program (see above), may have that student attend the same academy school as their student.

#### **SIBLINGS**

District resident sibling applicants of current 9th -11th grade students are eligible to attend either CCA or SDA as long as their sibling will be attending that academy in the Fall of the following school year. A CCA sibling has no priority at SDA and vice versa. Eligible siblings must declare their high school academy choice online during the high school selection filing period.

#### **CHANGING YOUR HIGH SCHOOL SELECTION**

All students who wish to change their previously submitted online high school selection must contact the District Office at the designated number.

Any changes to the high school selection will be accepted up to, and including the final day of the selection process. Changes after the close of the selection process will not be accepted.

#### **EQUAL CHANCE / APPLICATION SUBMITTAL**

There is no first-come first-served advantage to submitting an application prior to the deadline of the high school selection process. All applications submitted before the deadline will have an equal chance in the lottery for CCA/SDA.

#### **LOTTERY**

If necessary, a lottery will be drawn for Canyon Crest and/or San Dieguito Academies and the date and time will be announced.

#### **SELECTION DEADLINE IS FINAL**

The submitted high school selection is final at the close of the selection process. No changes will be permitted after the application deadline.

#### **LATE APPLICATIONS**

Late applicants (filing AFTER the deadline) will not be accepted. Please register/enroll at your boundary school.

#### **ENROLLMENT/REGISTRATION/COURSE SELECTION DEADLINE**

Students new to the district must enroll/register prior to course selection. Students who are selected to attend SDA/CCA are required to complete course selection by a designated date and time or they will lose their lottery position.

#### INTRA-DISTRICT TRANSFERS

Students with currently approved intra-districts transfers at LCC & TP do not need to reapply each year.

**STUDENTS** 5116.1 / AR-2

NEW LCC & TP intra-district transfer applicants: Students within the district may apply for intradistrict transfers between La Costa Canyon High School and Torrey Pines High School. New LCC/TP intra-district transfer applicants must complete an intra-district transfer application available online. Intra-district transfer applications must be delivered to the SDUHSD District Office by the designated date.

#### **INTER-DISTRICT TRANSFERS**

At this time the district is not approving new inter-district transfer permits. Students who are in good standing in attendance, behavior and scholarship who were enrolled on inter-district attendance permits prior to September 1, 2009 may continue to attend a non Academy school within the district until they graduate.

#### RELEASE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION

The Superintendent or designee may authorize the release of student directory information to representatives of the news media, prospective employers or nonprofit organizations as provided by law. Unless prohibited by the parent/guardian in accordance with law, directory information which school officials may disclose consists of the following: student's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of athletic team members, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and most recent previous school attended.

The Governing Board recognizes the importance of maintaining the confidentiality of directory information and therefore authorizes the release of such information only in accordance with law, Board policy, and administrative regulation.

The Superintendent or designee may release student directory information to representatives of the news media or nonprofit organizations in accordance with Board policy and administrative regulation.

The Superintendent or designee may limit or deny the release of specific categories of directory information to any public or private nonprofit organization based on his/her determination of the best interests of district students.

Colleges and prospective employers, including military recruiters, shall have access to directory information. Military recruiters shall have access to a student's name, address, and telephone number, unless the parent/guardian has specified that the information not be released in accordance with law and administrative regulation. (20 USC 7908; 10 USC 503;

Under no circumstances shall directory information be disclosed to a private profit-making entity, except for representatives of the news media and prospective employers, in accordance with Board policy. Private schools and colleges may be given the names and addresses of 12th-grade students and students who are no longer enrolled provided that they use this information only for purposes directly related to the institution's academic or professional goals. cf. 1113 - District and School Web Sites)

#### RELEASE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION

At the beginning of each school year, all parents/guardians shall be notified as to what the categories of directory information the school or district plans to release and the recipients of the information. The notification shall also inform parents/guardians of their right to refuse to let the district designate any or all types of information as directory information and the period of time within which a parent/guardian must notify the district in writing that he/she does not want a certain category of information designated as directory information. (34 CFR 99.37; Education Code 49063, 49073) (cf. 5125 - Student Records) (cf. 5145.6 - Parental Notifications)

Directory information means information contained in an education record of a student that would not generally be considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed. Such student information includes: (34 CFR 99.3; Education Code 49061)

- 1. Name
- 2. Address
- 3. Telephone number
- 4. Email address
- 5. Date and place of birth
- 6. Major field of study
- 7. Participation record in officially recognized activities and sports
- 8. Weight and height of athletic team members
- 9. Dates of attendance
- 10. Degrees and awards received
- 11. Most recent previous school attended

#### **NOTIFICATION TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS**

The Superintendent or designee shall notify parents/guardians that they may request that the district not release the name, address, and telephone number of their child to military recruiters, employers, or institutions of higher education without prior written consent. (20 USC 7908)

#### **PARENT/GUARDIAN CONSENT**

Directory information shall not be released regarding any student whose parent/guardian notifies the district in writing that such information not be disclosed without the parent/guardian's prior consent. (20 USC 1232g, 7908; Education Code 49073)

For a former student, the district shall continue to honor any valid request to opt out of the disclosure of directory information made while the student was in attendance at the district, unless the opt-out request has been rescinded. (34 CFR 99.37)

#### **HEAD LICE**

The Governing Board believes that the district's head lice management program should emphasize the correct diagnosis and treatment of head lice in order to minimize disruption of the education process and to reduce the number of student absences resulting from infestation

School employees shall report all suspected cases of head lice to the school nurse or designee. The nurse or designee shall examine the student and other students who are siblings of the affected student or members of the same household.

If a student is found with active, adult head lice, he/she shall be excluded from attendance. The parent/guardian of an excluded student shall receive information about recommended treatment procedures and sources of further information. The student shall be allowed to return to school the next day and shall be checked by the nurse or designee before returning to class. Once he/she is determined to be free of lice, the student shall be rechecked between 7 to 14 days once it has been determined that they are free of lice.

A "chronic" case is a student found infested during three separate months in a school year or for six consecutive weeks. The District reserves the right to have school sites refer students who have chronic incidents of head lice to the School Attendance Review Board (SARB). The principal and school nurse shall work with the parents/guardians of any student who has been deemed to be a chronic head lice case in order to help minimize the student's absences from school.

Note: The following optional paragraph should be modified to reflect district practice.

Staff shall maintain the privacy of students identified as having head lice and excluded from attendance.

#### SUSPENSION AND EXPULSION / DUE PROCESS

#### **DEFINITIONS**

**Suspension** from school means removal of a student from ongoing instruction for adjustment purposes. However, "suspension" does not mean any of the following: (Education Code 48925)

- Reassignment to another education program or class at the same school where the student will receive
  continuing instruction for the length of day prescribed by the Board of Trustees for students of the
  same grade level.
- 2. Referral to a certificated employee designated by the principal to advice students.
- 3. Removal from the class, but without reassignment to another class or program, for the remainder of the class period without sending the student to the principal or designee as provided in Education Code 48910. Removal from a particular class shall not occur more than once every five school days.

**Expulsion** means removal of a student from the immediate supervision and control, or the general supervision, of school personnel. (Education Code 48925)

**Day** means a calendar day unless otherwise specifically provided. (Education Code 48925)

**School day** means a day upon which the schools of the district are in session or weekdays during the summer recess. (Education Code 48925)

**Student** includes a student's parent/guardian or legal counsel. (Education Code 48925)

**Principal's designee** means one or more administrators or, if there is not a second administrator at one school site, a certificated person specifically designated by the principal, in writing, to assist with disciplinary procedures. Only one such person may be designated at any time as the principal's primary designee and only one such person may be designated as a secondary designee for the school year. The names of such persons shall be on file in the principal's office. (Education Code 48911)

School Property for the purposes described in Education Code 48900, includes but is not limited to electronic files and databases. (Education Code 48900©)

#### **NOTICE OF REGULATIONS**

At the beginning of each school year, the principal of each school shall ensure that all students and parents/guardians are notified in writing of all school rules related to discipline, suspension and expulsion. Transfer students and their parents/guardians shall be notified at the time of enrollment. (Education Codes 35291.5, 48900.1, 48980)

Notification shall include information about the availability of individual school rules and all district policies and regulations pertaining to student discipline. (Education Code 48900(a))

#### **GROUNDS FOR SUSPENSION AND EXPULSION**

Students may be subject to suspension or expulsion for committing any of the acts listed below:

1. Caused, attempted to cause, or threatened to cause physical injury to another person or willfully used

force or violence upon the person of another, except in self-defense. (Education Code 48900(a))

- 2. Possessed, sold, or otherwise furnished any firearm, knife, explosive, or other dangerous object unless, in the case of possession of any object of this type, the student had obtained written permission to possess the item from a certificated school employee, with the principal or designee's concurrence. (Education Code 48900(b))
- 3. Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or was under the influence of, any controlled substance as defined in the Health and Safety Code 11053-11058, alcoholic beverage, or intoxicant of any kind. (Education Code 48900(c))
- 4. Unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any controlled substance as defined in Health and Safety Code 11053-11058, alcoholic beverage or intoxicant of any kind, and then sold, delivered, or otherwise furnished to any person another liquid, substance or material and represented same as controlled substance, alcohol beverage or intoxicant. (Education Code 48900(d))
- Committed or attempted to commit robbery or extortion.
   (Education Code 48900(e))
- 6. Caused or attempted to cause damage to school property or private property. (Education Code 48900(f))
- 7. Stole or attempted to steal school property or private property. (Education Code (g))
- 8. Possessed or used tobacco or any products containing tobacco or nicotine products, including but not limited to cigars, cigarettes, miniature cigars, clove cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew packets and betel. This restriction shall not prohibit a student from using or possessing his/her own prescription products. (Education Code 48900(h))
- 9. Committed an obscene act or engaged in habitual profanity or vulgarity. (Education Code 48900(i))
- 10. Unlawfully possessed or unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any drug paraphernalia, as defined in Section 11014.5 of the Health and Safety Code. (Education Code 48900(j))
- 11. Disrupted school activities or otherwise willfully defied the valid authority of supervisors, teachers, administrators, other school officials, or other school personnel engaged in the performance of their duties. (Education Code 48900(k))
- 12. Knowingly received stolen school property or private property. (Education Code 48900(I))
- 13. Possessed an imitation firearm, i.e. a replica of a firearm that is so substantially similar in physical properties to an existing firearm as to lead a reasonable person to conclude that the replica is a firearm. (Education Code 48900(m))
- 14. Committed or attempted to commit a sexual assault as defined in Penal Code 261, 266c, 286, 288, 288a, or 289, or committed a sexual battery as defined in Penal Code 243.4 (Education Code 48900(n))
- 15. Harassed, threatened, or intimidated a student who is a complaining witness or witness in a school disciplinary proceeding for the purpose of preventing that student from being a witness and/or retaliating against that student for being a witness (Education Code 48900(o))
- Unlawfully offered, arranged to sell, negotiated to sell, or sold the prescription drug Soma. (Education Code 48900(p)) Made terrorist threats against school officials and/or school property (Education Code 48900.7)

A student in grades 4 through 12 is also subject to suspension or recommendation for expulsion when it is determined that he/she:

- 17. Engaged in, or attempted to engage in, hazing. (Education Code 48900(q))Committed sexual harassment as defined in Education Code 212.5 (Education Code 48900.2)
  - Hazing means a method of initiation or preinitiation into a student organization or body, whether or not the organization or body is officially recognized by an educational institution, which is likely to cause serious bodily injury or personal degradation or disgrace resulting in physical or mental harm to a former, current, or prospective student. Hazing does not include athletic events or school-sanctioned events. (Education Code 48900(q))
- 18. Made terrorist threats against school officials and/or school property. (Education Code 48900.7) Caused, attempted to cause, threatened to cause, or participated in an act of hate violence as defined in Education Code 33032.5 (Education Code 48900.3)

A student in grades 4-12 is also subject to suspension or recommendation for expulsion when it is determined that he/she:

- 19. Committed sexual harassment as defined in Education Code 212.5. (Education Code 48900.2)Intentionally harassed, threatened or intimidated a student or group of students to the extent of having the actual and reasonably expected effect of materially disrupting classwork, creating substantial disorder, and invading student rights by creating an intimidating or hostile educational environment (Education Code 48900.4)
- 20. Caused, attempted to cause, threatened to cause, or participated in an act of hate violence as defined in Education Code 233. (Education Code 48900.3)
- 21. Intentionally engaged in harassment, threats, or intimidation against district personnel or students that is sufficiently severe or pervasive to have the actual and reasonably expected effect of materially disrupting classwork, creating substantial disorder, and invading the rights of school personnel or students by creating an intimidating or hostile educational environment. (Education Code 48900.4)
- 22. Engaged in an act of bullying, including, but not limited to, bullying by means of an electronic act, directed toward a student or school personnel. (Education Code 48900(r))

Bullying means one or more acts by a student or group of students that constitute sexual harassment pursuant to Education Code 48900.2, as defined in item #19 above; hate violence pursuant to Education Code 48900.3, as defined in item #20 above; or harassment, threats, or intimidation pursuant to Education Code 48900.4, as defined in item #21 above. (Education Code 32261)

Electronic act means the transmission of a communication, including, but not limited to, a message, text, sound, or image by means of an electronic device, including, but not limited to, a telephone, wireless telephone, or other wireless communication device, computer, or pager. (Education Code 32261)

A student may be suspended or expelled for any of the acts listed above if the act is related to school activity or school attendance occurring at any district school under the jurisdiction of the Superintendent or principal or within any other school district, including but not limited to the following circumstances: (Education Code 48900)

- 1. While on school grounds
- 2. While going to or coming from school
- 3. During the lunch period, whether on or off the school campus
- 4. During, going to, or coming from a school-sponsored activity

#### **STUDENTS**

The Superintendent or principal may use his/her discretion to provide alternatives to suspension or expulsion for a student subject to discipline under this administrative regulation, including, but not limited to, counseling and an anger management program. (Education Code 48900(r))

Alternatives to suspension or expulsion, such as referral to SARB (School Attendance Review Board), will be used with students who are truant, tardy, or otherwise absent from assigned school activities.

#### SUSPENSION FROM CLASS BY A TEACHER/PARENTAL ATTENDANCE

A teacher may suspend any student from his/her class for the day of the suspension and the next day for any act listed in "Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion" above. (Education Code 48910)

A teacher also may refer a student to the principal or designee for consideration of suspension from school. (Education Code 48910)

When suspending a student from his/her class, the teacher shall immediately report this action to the principal and send the student to the principal for appropriate action. The student shall be appropriately supervised during the class periods from which he/she has been suspended.

As soon as possible, the teacher shall ask the student's parent/guardian to attend a parent-teacher conference regarding the suspension. A counselor or psychologist should attend the conference if it is practicable, and a school administrator may attend if either the parent/guardian or teacher so requests.

A suspended student shall not be returned to class during the period of suspension without the approval of the teacher of the class and the principal. (Education Code 48910)

A student suspended from class shall not be placed in another regular class during the period of suspension. However, if a student is assigned to more than one class per day, he/she may be placed in any other regular classes except those held at the same time as the class from which the student was suspended. (Education Code 48910)

The teacher of any class from which a student is suspended may require the suspended student to complete any assignments and tests missed during the suspension. (Education Code 48913)

Pursuant to Board policy, a teacher may require the parent/guardian of a student whom the teacher has suspended to attend a portion of a school day in his/her child's classroom. When a teacher makes this requirement, the principal shall send the parent/guardian a written notice that the parent/guardian's attendance is required pursuant to law. (Education Code 48900.1)

#### SUSPENSION BY SUPERINTENDENT, PRINCIPAL, OR PRINCIPAL'S DESIGNEE

The Superintendent, principal, or principal's designee may suspend a student from a school for not more than five consecutive school days unless the suspension is extended pending expulsion. (Education Code 48911)

The Superintendent or designee shall immediately suspend any student found at school or at a school activity to be: (Education Code 48915)

- 1. Possessing, as verified by a district employee, or selling or otherwise furnishing a firearm, unless the student had obtained prior written permission to possess the item from a certificated school employee, with the principal or designee's concurrence.
- 2. Brandishing a knife, as defined in Education Code 48915(g), at another person.

- 3. Unlawfully selling a controlled substance listed in Health and Safety Code 11053-11058.
- 4. Committing or attempting to commit a sexual assault or committing a sexual battery as defined in item #14 under "Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion" above.
- 5. Possession of an explosive as defined in 18 USC 921.

Explosive means a destructive device and includes, but is not limited to, any explosive, incendiary, or poison gas bomb, grenade, rocket having a propellant charge of more than four ounces, missile having an explosive or incendiary charge of more than one-quarter ounce, mine, or similar device. A destructive device includes any other type of weapon (except a shotgun or shotgun shell recognized by the United States Secretary of Army as suitable for sporting purposes) which might be converted to project an explosive. (18 USC 921)

Suspension also may be imposed upon a first offense if the Superintendent, principal or designee determines the student violated items (1) - (5) listed in "Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion" above or if the student's presence causes a danger to persons or property or threatens to disrupt the instructional process. (Education Code 48900.5)

A student may be suspended from school for not more than 20 school days in any school year, unless for purposes of adjustment a student enrolls in or is transferred to another regular school, an opportunity school, or continuation school or class, in which case suspension shall not exceed 30 days in any school year. However, this restriction on the number of days of suspension does not apply when the suspension is extended pending an expulsion. (Education Code 48903, 48911)

#### SUSPENSIONS SHALL BE INITIATED ACCORDING TO THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURES

#### 1. Informal Conference

Suspension shall be preceded by an informal conference conducted by the principal, designee or the Superintendent with the student and, whenever practicable, the teacher, supervisor or school employee who referred the student to the principal. At the conference, the student shall be informed of the reason for the disciplinary action and the evidence against him/her; the student shall be given the opportunity to present his/her version and evidence in support of his/her defense. (Education Code 48911(b))

This conference may be omitted if the principal, designee or the Superintendent determines that an emergency situation exists. An "emergency situation" involves a clear and present danger to the lives, safety or health of students or school personnel. If a student is suspended without this conference, both the parent/guardian and student shall be notified of the student's right to return to school for the purpose of a conference. The conference shall be held within two school days, unless the student waives his/her right to it or is physically unable to attend for any reason. In such case, the conference will be held as soon as the student is physically able to return to school. (Education Code 489II(c))

#### 2. Administrative Actions

All requests for student suspension are to be processed by the principal or designee of the school in which the student is enrolled at the time of the misbehavior.

The principal and/or designee will notify the appropriate law enforcement authority any time a student is accused of an offense for which expulsion must be recommended.

A school employee shall report the suspension, including the name of the student and the cause for the suspension, to the Superintendent or designee.

#### 3. Notice to Parents/Guardians

At the time of the suspension, a school employee shall make a reasonable effort to contact the parent/guardian by telephone or in person. Whenever a student is suspended, the parent/guardian shall be notified in writing of the suspension. (Education Code 48911)

This notice shall state the reasons for suspension and the date and time when the student may return to school. If school officials wish to ask the parent/guardian to confer regarding matters pertinent to the suspension, the notice may also add that state law requires the parent/guardian to respond to such requests without delay.

#### 4. Parent/Guardian Conference

Whenever a student is suspended, school officials may meet with the parent/guardian to discuss the causes and duration of the suspension, the school policy involved, and any other pertinent matters. (Education Code 48914)

While the parent/guardian is required to respond without delay to a request for a conference about a student's behavior, no penalties may be imposed on the student for the failure of the parent/guardian to attend such conference. The student may not be denied readmission solely because the parent/guardian failed to attend. (Education Code 48911)

#### 5. Extension of Suspension

If the Board is considering the expulsion of a suspended student from any school or the suspension of a student for the balance of the semester from continuation school, the Superintendent or designee may, in writing, extend the suspension until such time as the Board has made a decision. (Education Code 48911(g))

Any extension of the original period of suspension shall be preceded by notice of such extension with an offer to hold a conference concerning the extension, giving the student an opportunity to be heard. This conference may be held in conjunction with a meeting requested by the student or parent/guardian to challenge the original suspension. Extension of the suspension may be made only if the Superintendent or designee determines, following a meeting in which the student and the student's parent/guardian were invited to participate, that the student's presence at the school or at an alternative school would endanger persons or property or threaten to disrupt the instructional process. (Education Code 48911)

#### SUSPENSION BY THE BOARD

The Board may suspend a student enrolled in a continuation school or class for a period not longer than the remainder of the semester if any of the acts enumerated in Education Code 48900 occurred. The suspension shall meet the requirements of Education Code 48915. (Education Code 48912.5)

When the Board is considering a suspension, disciplinary action, or any other action (except expulsion) against any student, it may hold closed sessions if a public hearing would lead to disclosure of information which would violate a student's right to privacy under Education Code 49073-49079.

The Board shall provide the student and his/her parent/guardian with written notice of the closed session by registered or certified mail. Upon receiving this notice, the student or parent/guardian may request a public meeting, and this request shall be granted if made in writing within 48 hours after receipt of the Board's notice. However, any discussion that conflicts with any other student's right to privacy still shall be held in closed session. (Education Code 35146, 48912)

#### **AUTHORITY TO EXPEL**

A student may be expelled only by the Board. The Board shall expel, as required by law, any student found to have committed certain offenses listed below under "Mandatory Recommendation and Mandatory Expulsion."

The Board also may order a student expelled for any of the acts listed above under "Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion" upon recommendation by the principal, Superintendent, hearing officer or administrative panel, based on finding either or both of the following: (Education Code 48915 (b) and (e))

- 1. That other means of correction are not feasible or have repeatedly failed to bring about proper conduct.
- 2. That due to the nature of the violation, the presence of the student causes a continuing danger to the physical safety of the student or others.

#### MANDATORY RECOMMENDATION FOR EXPULSION

Unless the principal or Superintendent finds that expulsion is inappropriate due to particular circumstances, the principal, Superintendent or designee shall recommend a student's expulsion for any of the following acts: (Education Code 48915(a))

- 1. Causing serious physical injury to another person, except in self-defense.
- 2. Possession of any knife as defined in Education Code 48915(g), explosive or other dangerous object of no reasonable use to the student.
- 3. Unlawful possession of any controlled substance, as listed in Chapter 10 (commencing with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code, except for the first offense for the possession of not more than one ounce of marijuana, other than concentrated cannabis.
- 4. Robbery or extortion.
- 5. Assault or battery, as defined in Penal Code 240 and 242, upon any school employee.

#### MANDATORY RECOMMENDATION AND MANDATORY EXPULSION

The principal, Superintendent or designee shall recommend that the Board expel any student found at school or at a school activity to be: (Education Code 48915(c))

- Possessing, as verified by a district employee, or selling or otherwise furnishing a firearm, unless the student had obtained prior written permission to possess the item from a certificated school employee, with the principal or designee's concurrence.
- 2. Brandishing a knife as defined in Education Code 48915(g) at another person.
- 3. Unlawfully selling a controlled substance listed in Health and Safety Code 11053-11058.
- 4. Committing or attempting to commit a sexual assault or committing a sexual battery as defined in item #14 under "Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion" above.
- 5. Possessing an explosive as defined in 18 USC 921.

Upon finding that the student committed any of these acts, the Board shall expel the student for one calendar year from the date the expulsion action occurred.

#### STUDENT'S RIGHT TO EXPULSION HEARING

The student is entitled to a hearing to determine whether the student should be expelled. The hearing shall be

#### **STUDENTS**

held within 30 school days after the principal or Superintendent or designee determines that one of the acts listed under "Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion" has occurred. (Education Code 48918(a))

The student is entitled to one postponement of an expulsion hearing for a period of not more than 30 calendar days. The request for postponement shall be in writing. Any subsequent postponement may be granted at the Board's discretion. (Education Code 48918(a))

If it will be impractical for the Board to comply with these time requirements for conducting an expulsion hearing, the Superintendent or designee may, for good cause, extend the time period by an additional five school days. Reasons for the extension shall be included as a part of the record when the expulsion hearing is held. (Education Code 48918(a))

Once the hearing starts, all matters shall be pursued with reasonable diligence and concluded without unnecessary delay. (Education Code 48918(a))

#### RIGHTS OF COMPLAINING WITNESS

An expulsion hearing involving allegations of sexual assault or sexual battery may be postponed for one school day in order to accommodate the special physical, mental or emotional needs of a student who is the complaining witness. (Education Code 48918.5)

Whenever the Superintendent or designee recommends an expulsion hearing that addresses allegations of sexual assault or sexual battery, he/she shall give the complaining witness a copy of the district's suspension and expulsion policy and regulation and shall advise the witness of his/her right to: (Education Code 48918.5)

- 1. Receive five days' notice of his/her scheduled testimony at the hearing
- 2. Have up to two adult support persons of his/her choosing present in the hearing at the time he/she testifies
- 3. Have a closed hearing during the time he/she testifies

Whenever any allegation of sexual assault or sexual battery is made, the Superintendent or designee shall immediately advise complaining witnesses and accused students to refrain from personal or telephone contact with each other during the time when an expulsion process is pending. (Education Code 48918.5)

#### WRITTEN NOTICE OF THE EXPULSION HEARING

Written notice of the hearing shall be forwarded to the student and the student's parent/guardian at least 10 calendar days before the date of the hearing. The notice shall include: (Education Code 48918(b))

- 1. The date and place of the hearing.
- 2. A statement of the specific facts and charges upon which the proposed expulsion is based.
- 3. A copy of district disciplinary guidelines which relate to the alleged violation.
- 4. Notification of the student's or parent/guardian's obligation, pursuant to Education Code 48915.1, to provide information about the student's status in the district to any other district in which the student seeks enrollment.
- 5. The opportunity for the student or the student's parent/guardian to appear in person or to employ and be represented by counsel.
- The right to inspect and obtain copies of all documents to be used at the hearing.
- 7. The opportunity to confront and question all witnesses who testify at the hearing.

8. The opportunity to question all evidence presented and to present oral and documentary evidence on the student's behalf, including witnesses.

#### **CONDUCT OF EXPULSION HEARING**

- Closed Session: Notwithstanding the provisions of Government Code 54953 and Education Code 35145,
  the Board shall conduct a hearing to consider the expulsion of the student in a session closed to the
  public unless the student requests in writing at least five days prior to the hearing that the hearing be a
  public meeting. If such request is made, the meeting shall be public unless another student's privacy
  rights would be violated.
  - Whether the expulsion hearing is held in closed or public session, the Board may meet in closed session to determine if the student should be expelled.
  - If the Board admits any other person to the closed session, the parent/guardian, the student, and the counsel of the student shall also be allowed to attend the closed session. (Education Code 48918(c))
- 2. Record of Hearing: A record of hearing shall be made and may be maintained by any means, including electronic recording, as long as a reasonably accurate written and complete transcription of the proceedings can be made. (Education Code 48918(g))
- 3. Subpoenas: Before commencing a student expulsion hearing, the Board may issue subpoenas, at the request of either the student or the Superintendent or designee, for the personal appearance at the hearing of any person who actually witnessed the action that gave rise to the recommendation for expulsion. After the hearing has commenced, the Board or the hearing officer or administrative panel may issue such subpoenas at the request of the student or the County Superintendent of Schools or designee. All subpoenas shall be issued in accordance with the Code of Civil Procedure 1985-1985.2 and enforced in accordance with Government Code 11455.20 (formerly 11525). (Education Code 48918(i))
  - Any objection raised by the student or the Superintendent or designee to the issuance of subpoenas may be considered by the Board in closed session, or in open session if so requested by the student, before the meeting. The Board's decision in response to such an objection shall be final and binding. (Education Code 48918(i))
  - If the Board determines, or if the hearing officer or administrative panel finds and submits to the Board, that a witness would be subject to unreasonable risk of harm by testifying at the hearing, a subpoena shall not be issued to compel the personal attendance of that witness at the hearing. However, that witness may be compelled to testify by means of a sworn declaration. (Education Code 48918(i))
- 4. Presentation of Evidence: While technical rules of evidence do not apply to expulsion hearings, evidence may be admitted and used as proof only if it is the kind of evidence on which reasonable persons can rely in the conduct of serious affairs. The decision of the Board to expel must be supported by substantial evidence that the student committed any of the acts listed in "Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion."
  - Findings of fact shall be based solely on the evidence at the hearing. While no evidence shall be based solely on hearsay, sworn declarations may be admitted as testimony from witnesses whose disclosure may subject them to an unreasonable risk of harm. (Education Code 48918 (f) and (h))
  - In cases where a search of a student's person or property has occurred, evidence describing the reasonableness of the search shall be included in the hearing record.
- 5. Decision Within 10 Days: The Board's decision on whether to expel a student shall be made within 10 school days after the conclusion of the hearing, unless the student requests in writing that the decision be postponed. (Education Code 48918(a)) Testimony by Complaining Witnesses: The following procedures shall be observed when hearings involve allegations of sexual assault or sexual battery by a student: (Education Code 48918, 48918.5)

- a. Any complaining witness shall be given five days' notice before being called to testify.
- b. Any complaining witness shall be entitled to have up to two adult support persons, including, but not limited to, a parent/guardian or legal counsel, present during his/her testimony.
- c. Before a complaining witness testifies, support persons shall be admonished that the hearing is confidential.
- d. The person presiding over the hearing may remove a support person whom he/she finds is disrupting the hearing.
- e. If one or both support persons are also witnesses, the hearing shall be conducted in accordance with Penal Code 868.5.
- f. Evidence of specific instances of prior sexual conduct of a complaining witness shall be presumed inadmissible and shall not be heard unless the person conducting the hearing determines that extraordinary circumstances require the evidence to be heard. Before such a determination is made, the complaining witness shall be given notice and an opportunity to oppose the introduction of this evidence. In the hearing on the admissibility of this evidence, the complaining witness shall be entitled to be represented by a parent/guardian, legal counsel, or other support person. Reputation or opinion evidence regarding the sexual behavior of a complaining witness shall not be admissible for any purpose.
- g. In order to facilitate a free and accurate statement of the experiences of the complaining witness and to prevent discouragement of complaints, the district shall provide a nonthreatening environment.
  - (1) The district shall provide a room separate from the hearing room for the use of the complaining witness before and during breaks in testimony.
  - (2) At the discretion of the person conducting the hearing, the complaining witness shall be allowed reasonable periods of relief from examination and cross-examination during which he/she may leave the hearing room.
  - (3) The person conducting the hearing may:
    - (a) Arrange the seating within the hearing room so as to facilitate a less intimidating environment for the complaining witness
    - (b) Limit the time for taking the testimony of a complaining witness to the hours he/she is normally in school, if there is no good cause to take the testimony during other hours
    - (c) Permit one of the support persons to accompany the complaining witness to the witness stand
- 6.. Decision Within 40 Days: If the Board does not meet on a weekly basis, its decision on whether to expel a student shall be made within 40 school days after the student is removed from his/her school of attendance, unless the student requests in writing that the decision be postponed. (Education Code 48918(a))

#### ALTERNATIVE EXPULSION HEARING: HEARING OFFICER OR ADMINISTRATIVE PANEL

The Board may appoint an impartial administrative panel composed of three or more certificated personnel, none of whom shall be members of the Board or on the staff of the school in which the student is enrolled. (Education Code 48918(d))

A hearing conducted by the hearing officer or administrative panel shall conform to the same procedures as apply to a hearing conducted by the Board as specified above in "Conduct of Expulsion Hearing."

The hearing officer or administrative panel shall, within three school days after the hearing, determine whether to recommend expulsion of the student to the Board. If expulsion is not recommended, the student shall be immediately reinstated. (See "Final Action by the Board" below.) (Education Code 48918(e)

If expulsion is recommended, findings of fact in support of the recommendation shall be prepared and submitted to the Board. All findings of fact and recommendations shall be based solely on the evidence presented at the hearing. The Board may accept the recommendation based either upon a review of the findings of fact and recommendations submitted or upon the results of any supplementary hearing the Board may order. (Education Code 48918(f))

The hearing officer or administrative panel may recommend that the Board suspend the expulsion for a period of one year. (See "Suspension of Expulsion below.")

The Board shall make its decision about the student's expulsion within 40 school days after the date of the student's removal from school unless the student requests in writing that the decision be postponed. (Education Code 48918(a))

#### **FINAL ACTION BY THE BOARD**

Whether the expulsion hearing is conducted in closed or public session by the Board, a hearing officer, or an administrative panel, the final action to expel must be taken by the Board at a public meeting. (Education Code 48918(j))

When the Board accepts a recommendation against expulsion or decides after the hearing not to expel, the decision is final and the student shall be reinstated immediately. The superintendent or designee shall place the student in any classroom program, other instructional program, rehabilitation program, or any combination of such programs after consulting with district personnel, including the teacher involved, and with the student's parent/guardian. (Education Code 48918(e))

Upon ordering an expulsion, the Board shall set a date when the student shall be reviewed for readmission to a school within the district. For a student expelled for an act listed under "Mandatory Recommendation and Mandatory Expulsion" above, this date shall be one year from the date the expulsion occurred, except that the Board may set an earlier date on a case-by-case basis. For a student expelled for other acts, this date shall be no later than the last day of the semester following the semester in which the expulsion occurred. (Education Code 48916)

At the time of the expulsion order, the Board shall recommend a plan for the student's rehabilitation, which may include: (Education Code 48916)

For a student expelled for an act listed under <u>Mandatory Recommendation and Mandatory Expulsion</u> above, this date shall be one year from the date the expulsion occurred, except that the Board may set an earlier date on a case-by-case basis. For a student expelled for other acts, this date shall be no later than the last day of the semester following the semester in which the expulsion occurred. (Education Code 48916)

The Board may recommend a plan for the student's rehabilitation, which may include: (Education Code 48916)

- 1. Periodic review as well as assessment of the student at the time of review for readmission.
- 2. Recommendations for improved academic performance, tutoring, special education assessments, job training, counseling, employment, community service and other rehabilitative programs.

With parental consent, students who have been expelled for reasons relating to controlled substances or alcohol may be required to enroll in a county-sponsored drug rehabilitation program before returning to school.

(Education Code 48916.5)

#### WRITTEN NOTICE TO EXPEL

The Superintendent or designee shall send written notice of the decision to expel to the student or parent/guardian. This notice shall include the following:

- 1. The specific offense committed by the student for any of the causes for suspension or expulsion listed in Education Code 48900, 48900.2, 48900.3, 48900.4, 48900.7, or 48915 (Education Code 48900.8)
- 2. The fact that a description of readmission procedures will be made available to the student and his/her parent/guardian (Education Code 48916)
- Notice of the right to appeal the expulsion to the County Board of Education (Education Code 48918)
- 4. Notice of the alternative educational placement to be provided to the student during the time of expulsion (Education Code 48918)
- Notice of the student's or parent/guardian's obligation to inform any new district in which the student seeks to enroll of the student's status with the expelling district, pursuant to Education Code 48915.1 (Education Code 48918)

#### SUSPENSION OF EXPULSION

The suspension of expulsion shall be governed by the following: (Education Code 48917)

1. The Board, upon voting to expel a student, may suspend the enforcement of the expulsion order for not more than one calendar year and may, as a condition of the suspension of enforcement, assign the student to a school, class or program appropriate for the student's rehabilitation. This rehabilitation program may provide for the involvement of the student's parent/guardian; however, the latter's refusal to participate in the rehabilitation program shall not be considered in the Board's determination as to whether the student has satisfactorily completed the rehabilitation program.

When deciding whether to suspend an expulsion, the Board shall take into account the following criteria:

- a. The student's previous behavior.
- b. The seriousness of the misconduct.
- c. The student's attitude toward the misconduct and his/her willingness to follow a rehabilitation program.

Expulsion orders shall not be suspended by the Board in cases of mandatory expulsion. (Education Code 48915(c))

- 2. During the period of the suspension of the expulsion order, the student shall be on probationary status.
- 3. The suspension of expulsion order may be revoked by the Board if the student commits any of the acts listed under "Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion" above or violates any of the district's rules and regulations governing student conduct.
- 4. When the suspension of expulsion order is revoked, a student may be expelled under the terms of the original expulsion order.
- 5. Upon satisfactory completion of the rehabilitation assignment, the Board shall reinstate the student in a district school. Upon reinstatement, the Board may order the expunging of any or all records of the expulsion proceedings.
- 6. Suspension of an expulsion order shall not affect the time period and requirements for the filing of an

appeal of the expulsion order with the County Board of Education.

7. The Superintendent or designee shall send written notice of any decision to suspend the enforcement of an expulsion order during a period of probation to the student or parent/guardian.

The notice shall also inform the parent/guardian of the right to appeal the expulsion to the County Board of Education. (Education Code 48918(j)).

#### **RIGHT TO APPEAL**

The student or parent/guardian is entitled to file an appeal of the Board's decision to the County Board of Education. The appeal must be filed within 30 days of the Board's decision to expel, even if the expulsion action is suspended and the student is placed on probation. (Education Code 48919)

The student shall submit a written request for a copy of the written transcripts and supporting documents from the district simultaneously with the filing of the notice of appeal with the County Board. The district shall provide the student with these documents within 10 school days following the student's written request. (Education Code 48919)

#### POST-EXPULSION ASSIGNMENTS PLACEMENTS

The Board shall refer expelled students to a program of study that meets all of the following conditions: (Education Code 48915)

- Appropriately prepared to accommodate students who exhibit discipline problems
- 2. Not provided at a comprehensive middle, junior, or senior high school or at any elementary school
- 3. Not housed at the school site attended by the student at the time of suspension. When the placement described above is not available, and when the County Superintendent of Schools so certifies, students expelled for acts described in items #6 through #15 under "Grounds for Suspension and Expulsion" may be instead referred to a program of study that is provided at another comprehensive middle, junior, or senior high school, or at an elementary school.

#### **READMISSION AFTER EXPULSION**

In accordance with the terms of the expulsion order, the student or parent/guardian may request the student's readmission to a district school. (Education Code 48916)

#### Readmission procedures shall be as follows:

- 1. A written request for readmission shall be submitted by the parent/guardian to the Superintendent or designee On the date set by the Board when it ordered the expulsion, the district shall consider readmission of the student. (Education Code 48916)
- 1.2. A written request for readmission shall be submitted by the parent/guardian to the Superintendent or designee.
- 2.3. The Superintendent or designee shall hold a conference with the parent/guardian and the student. At the conference, the conditions for readmission shall be reviewed. The Superintendent or designee shall verify that these conditions have been met. School regulations shall be reviewed and the student and parent/guardian shall be asked to indicate in writing their willingness to comply with these regulations.
- 4. The Superintendent or designee shall transmit the request for readmission to the Board, along with his/her recommendation. The Board shall consider the request in closed session if information would be disclosed in violation of Education Code 49073-49079. If a written request for open session is received from the parent/guardian or adult student, it shall be honored.

- 3.5. If readmission is granted, the Superintendent or designee shall notify the student and parent/guardian, by registered mail, of the Board's decision regarding readmission.
- 4.6. The Board may deny readmission only if it finds that the student has not satisfied the conditions of the rehabilitation plan or that the student continues to pose a danger to campus safety or to other district students or employees. (Education Code 48916)
- 5.7. If the Board denies the readmission of a student, the Board shall determine either to continue the student's placement in the alternative educational program initially selected or to place the student in another program that serves expelled students, including placement in a county community school. (Education Code 48916)
- 6.8. The Superintendent or designee shall notify the student and parent/guardian, by registered mail, of the Board's decision regarding readmission.

#### **MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS**

The Board shall maintain a record of each expulsion, including the cause of the expulsion. The expulsion record shall be maintained in the student's mandatory interim record and sent to any school in which the student subsequently enrolls, within five days of a written request by the admitting school. (Education Code 48918(k))

The Superintendent or designee shall, within five working days, honor any other district's request for information about an expulsion from this district. (Education Code 48915.1)

#### NOTIFICATION TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITIES

Prior to the suspension or expulsion of any student, the principal or designee shall notify appropriate city or county law enforcement authorities of any student acts of assault which may have violated Penal Code 245. (Education Code 48902)

The principal or designee also shall notify appropriate city or county law enforcement authorities of any student acts which may involve the possession or sale of narcotics or of a controlled substance or possession of weapons or firearms in violation of Penal Code 626.9 and 626.10. (Education Code 48902)

Within one school day after a student's suspension or expulsion, the principal or designee shall notify appropriate city or county law enforcement authorities, by telephone or other appropriate means, of any student acts which may violate Education Code 48900 (c) or (d), relating to the possession, use, offering or sale of controlled substances, alcohol, or intoxicants of any kind. (Education Code 48902)

#### **OUTCOME DATA**

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain the following data and report such data annually to the California Department of Education, using forms supplied by the California Department of Education: (Education Code 48900.8, 48916.1)

- 1. The number of students recommended for expulsion
- 2. The specific grounds for each recommended expulsion
- 3. Whether the student was subsequently expelled
- 4. Whether the expulsion order was suspended
- 5. The type of referral made after the expulsion
- 6. The disposition of the student after the end of the expulsion period

#### SUSPENSION AND EXPLUSION / DUE PROCESS (STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES)

#### **Suspension**

A student identified as an individual with a disability pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), 20 USC 1400-1482, is subject to the same grounds for suspension and expulsion which apply to regular education-students without disabilities. All the procedural safeguards established by district policies and regulations shall be observed in considering the suspension of students with disabilities. (cf. 5144.1 - Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process)

#### PROCEDURES FOR STUDENTS NOT YET ELIGIBLE FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICE

A student who has not been officially identified as a student with a disability pursuant to IDEA and who has engaged in behavior that violated the district's code of student conduct may assert any of the protections under IDEA only if the district had knowledge that the student is disabled before the behavior that precipitated the disciplinary action occurred. (20 USC 1415(k)(5); 34 CFR 300.534)

The district shall be deemed to have knowledge that the student has a disability if one of the following conditions exists: (20 USC 1415(k)(5); 34 CFR 300.534)

- The parent/guardian has expressed concern to district supervisory or administrative personnel
  In writing, or to a teacher of the student, that the student is in need of special education or
  related services.
- 2. The parent/guardian has requested an evaluation of the student for special education pursuant to 34 CFR 300.300-300.311. (cf. 6164.4 Identification and Evaluation of Individuals for Special Education)
- The teacher of the student or other district personnel has expressed specific concerns directly to the district's director of special education or to other supervisory district personnel about a pattern of behavior demonstrated by the student.

The district would be deemed to not have knowledge that a student is disabled if the parent/guardian has not allowed the student to be evaluated for special education services or has refused services. In addition, the district would be deemed to not have knowledge if the district conducted an evaluation pursuant to 34 CFR 300.300-300.311 and determined that the student was not an individual with a disability. When the district is deemed to not have knowledge of the disability, the student shall be disciplined in accordance with procedures established for students without disabilities who engage in comparable behavior. (20 USC 1415(k)(5); 34 CFR 300.534)

If a request is made for an evaluation of a student during the time period in which the student is subject to disciplinary measures pursuant to 34 CFR 300.530, the evaluation shall be conducted in an expedited manner. Until the evaluation is completed, the student shall remain in the educational placement determined by school authorities. (20 USC 1415(k)(5); 34 CFR 300.534)

#### **SUSPENSION**

The Superintendent or designee may suspend a student with a disability for up to 5-10 consecutive school days for a single incident of misconduct, and for up to 20 school days in a school year, as long as the suspension(s) does not constitute a change in placement pursuant to 34 CFR 300.536. (34 CFR 300.530; Education Code 48903). If the student is transferred to another school or alternative educational program,

the student may be suspended for up to 30 days in a school year, but still no more than five days for a single incident of misconduct, unless the student is suspended by the Board of Trustees pursuant to Education Code 48911.

#### SERVICES DURING SUSPENSION

Any student suspended for more than 10 school days in the same school year shall continue to receive services during the term of the suspension. School personnel, in consultation with at least one of the student's teachers, shall determine the extent to which services are needed as provided in 34 CFR 300.101(a), so as to enable the student to continue to participate in the general education curriculum in another setting and to progress toward meeting the goals as set out in his/her IEP. (20 USC 1412(a)(1)(A); 34 CFR 300.530)

If a student with a disability is excluded from school bus transportation, the student shall be provided with an alternative form of transportation at no cost to the student or his/her parent/guardian, provided that transportation is specified in his/her IEP. (Education Code 48915.5) (cf. 3541.2 - Transportation for Students with Disabilities)

#### INTERIM ALTERNATIVE EDUCATIONAL PLACEMENT DUE TO DANGEROUS BEHAVIOR

The district may unilaterally place a student with a disability in an appropriate interim alternative educational setting for up to 45 school days, without regard to whether the behavior is a manifestation of the student's disability, when the student commits one of the following acts while at school, going to or from school, or at a school-related function: (20 USC 1415(k)(1)(G); 34 CFR 300.530)

- 1. Carries or possesses a weapon, as defined in 18 USC 930
- 2. Knowingly possesses or uses illegal drugs
- 3. Sells or solicits the sale of a controlled substance as identified in 21 USC 812(c), Schedules I-V
- 4. Inflicts serious bodily injury upon another person as defined in 18 USC 1365

The student's interim alternative educational setting shall be determined by his/her IEP team. (20 USC 1415(k)(1)(G); 34 CFR 300.531)

On the date the decision to take disciplinary action is made, the parents/guardians of the student shall be notified of the decision and provided the procedural safeguards notice pursuant to 34 CFR 300.504. (20 USC 1415(k)(1)(H); 34 CFR 300.530)

A student who has been removed from his/her current placement because of dangerous behavior shall receive services, although in another setting, to the extent necessary to allow him/her to participate in the general education curriculum and to progress toward meeting the goals set out in his/her IEP. As appropriate, the student shall also receive a functional behavioral assessment and behavioral intervention services and modifications that are designed to address the behavior violation so that it does not recur. (20 USC 1415(k)(1)(D); 34 CFR 300.530)

#### MANIFESTATION DETERMINATION

The following procedural safeguards shall apply when a student with a disability is suspended for more than 10 consecutive school days, when a series of removals of a student constitutes a pattern, or when a change

of placement of a student is contemplated due to a violation of the district's code of conduct: (cf. 5145.6 - Parental Notifications) (cf. 6159.1 - Procedural Safeguards and Complaints for Special Education)

#### **MANIFESTATION DETERMINATION REVIEW**

Immediately if possible, but in no case later than 10 school days after the date the decision to take disciplinary action is made, a manifestation determination review shall be made of the relationship between the student's disability and the behavior subject to the disciplinary action. (20 USC 1415(k)(1)(E); 34 CFR 300.530)

At the manifestation determination review, the district, the student's parent/guardian, and relevant members of the IEP team (as determined by the district and parent/guardian) shall review all relevant information in the student's file, including the student's IEP, any teacher observations, and any relevant information provided by the parents/guardians, to determine whether the conduct in question was either of the following: (20 USC 1415(k)(1)(E); 34 CFR 300.530)

- a. Caused by or had a direct and substantial relationship to the student's disability
- b. A direct result of the district's failure to implement the student's IEP, in which case the district shall take immediate steps to remedy those deficiencies

If the manifestation review team determines that a condition in either #a or #b above was met, the conduct shall then be determined to be a manifestation of the student's disability. (20 USC 1415(k)(1)(E); 34 CFR 300.530)

#### DETERMINATION THAT BEHAVIOR IS A MANIFESTATION OF THE STUDENT'S DISABILITY

When the conduct has been determined to be a manifestation of the student's disability, the IEP team shall conduct a functional behavioral assessment, unless a functional behavioral assessment had been conducted before the occurrence of the behavior that resulted in the change of placement, and shall implement a behavioral intervention plan for the student. If a behavioral intervention plan has already been developed, the IEP team shall review the behavioral intervention plan and modify it as necessary to address the behavior. (20 USC 1415(k)(1)(F); 34 CFR 300.530)

The student shall be returned to the placement from which he/she was removed, unless the parent/guardian and district agree to a change of placement as part of the modification of the behavioral intervention plan. (20 USC 1415(k)(1)(F); 34 CFR 300.530) (cf. 6159.4 - Behavioral Interventions for Special Education Students)

#### DETERMINATION THAT BEHAVIOR IS NOT A MANIFESTATION OF THE STUDENT'S DISABILITY

If the manifestation determination review team determines that the student's behavior was not a manifestation of his/her disability, the student may be disciplined in accordance with the procedures for students without disabilities. (20 USC 1415(k)(1)(D); 34 CFR 300.530)

The student shall receive services to the extent necessary to participate in the general education curriculum in another setting and to allow him/her to progress toward meeting the goals set out in his/her IEP. As appropriate, the student also shall receive a functional behavioral assessment and behavioral intervention services and modifications that are designed to address the behavior violation so that it does not recur. (20 USC 1415(k)(1)(D); 34 CFR 300.530) cf. 6158 - Independent Study) (cf. 6185 - Community Day School)

#### **DUE PROCESS APPEALS**

If the parent/guardian disagrees with any district decision regarding placement under 34 CFR 300.530 (suspension and removal for dangerous circumstances) or 34 CFR 300.531 (interim alternative placement), or the manifestation determination under 34 CFR 300.530(e), he/she may appeal the decision by requesting a hearing. The district may request a hearing if the district believes that maintaining the student's current placement is substantially likely to result in injury to the student or others. In order to request a hearing, the requesting party shall file a complaint pursuant to 34 CFR 300.507 and 300.508(a) and (b). (20 USC 1415(k)(3); 34 CFR 300.532)

Note: Pursuant to 34 CFR 300.532, this due process hearing is the same as the impartial due process hearing held for other special education matters, except that the law specifies expedited timelines. For other due process hearing requirements, see BP/AR 6159.1 - Procedural Safeguards and Complaints for Special Education.

Whenever a hearing is requested as specified above, the parent/guardian or the district shall have an opportunity for an expedited due process hearing consistent with requirements specified in 34 CFR 300.507, 300.508 (a)-(c), and 300.510-300.514.

If the student's parent/guardian or the district has initiated a due process hearing under 34 CFR 300.532 as detailed above, the student shall remain in the interim alternative educational setting pending the decision of the hearing officer or until the expiration of the 45-day time period, whichever occurs first, unless the parent/guardian and district agree otherwise. (20 USC 1415(k)(4); 34 CFR 300.533)

#### **READMISSION**

Readmission procedures for students with disabilities shall be the same as those used for all students. Upon readmission, an IEP team meeting shall be convened.

#### SUSPENSION OF EXPULSION

The Governing Board's criteria for suspending the enforcement of an expulsion order shall be applied to students with disabilities in the same manner as they are applied to all other students. (Education Code 48917)

#### **NOTIFICATION TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITIES**

Law enforcement notification requirements involving students with disabilities shall be the same as those specified for all students in AR 5144.1 - Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process. (cf. 5131.7 - Weapons and Dangerous Instruments)

#### REPORT TO COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

The Superintendent or designee shall report to the County Superintendent of Schools when any special education student has been expelled or suspended for more than 10 school days. The report shall include the student's name, last known address, and the reason for the action. (Education Code 48203)

If a student with disability possesses an immediate threat to the safety of himself/herself or others, the Superintendent or designee may suspend the student for up to but not more than, 10 consecutive school days. In the case of a dangerous student, a suspension may exceed 10 consecutive school days, and/or the student's placement may be changed, if the parent/guardian so agrees or if a court order so provides.

If a student with disability possesses at school or at a school activity a weapon as defined in the United States Code, Title 18, Section 921, he/she shall be immediately suspended and may be placed in an alternative educational setting for not more than 45 calendar days, or until the conclusion of any due process proceedings requested by the parent/guardian. The student's alternative educational setting shall be determined by the student's IEP team.

#### **Monitoring of Suspensions**

Whenever a student identified as an individual with disability has been suspended on three separate occasions or for a total of five days, whichever occurs first, the student's individualized education program (IEP) team shall meet to consider:

- Whether the student's misconduct was related to his/her disability,
- Whether the misconduct was the result of an inappropriate placement, and
- 3. Whether a change in placement has occurred as a result of the cumulative suspensions.

Based on its findings, the IEP team shall determine whether to initiate alternatives to suspension, a change in placement, or other changes to the student's IEP or accommodation plan.

#### **Expulsion**

Procedures and timelines governing the expulsion of students with disabilities shall be the same as those for all other students, except that a pre-expulsion assessment shall be made and an IEP team or school site committee meeting held under conditions and with possible consequences indicated below.

#### **Pre Expulsion Assessment and Meeting**

- 1. The parent/guardian shall receive written notice of the district's intent to conduct the pre-expulsion assessment and shall make the student available for the assessment without delay at a site designated by the district. The parent/guardian shall also have the right to an independent assessment as provided in Education Code 56329.
- The pre-expulsion assessment shall be conducted in accordance with the guidelines of the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 34, Section 104.35, which shall include a review of the student's placement at the time of the alleged misconduct and a determination of the relationship, if any, between the

student's behavior and his/her disability.

- 3. The IEP team shall meet to determine if an expulsion hearing is appropriate. This meeting shall be held at a time and place mutually convenient to the parent/guardian and district within the period, if any, of the student's pre-expulsion suspension. The parent/guardian's participation may be made through actual participation, representation, or a telephone conference call.
- 4. The parent/guardian shall be notified of his/her right to participate in the meeting at least 48 hours before the meeting. This notice shall specify:
  - That the meeting may be held without the parent/guardian's participation unless he/she requests a postponement for up to three additional school days, and
  - That the suspension will be continued during the postponement if the student continues to pose an immediate threat to the safety of himself/herself or others.

In order to make a record of its attempts to arrange the meeting at a mutually convenient time and place, the district shall keep documentation such as:

- a. Detailed records of telephone calls made or attempted and the results of those calls.
- b. Copies of correspondence sent to parents/guardians and any responses received.
- c. Detailed records of visits made to the parent/guardian's home or place of employment and the results of those visits.
- 5. The district shall grant a parent/guardian's request that the meeting be postponed for up to three additional school days and may extend a student's suspension for the period of postponement if he/she continues to pose an immediate threat to the safety of himself/herself or others. However, the suspension shall not be extended beyond 10 consecutive school days unless agreed to by the parent/guardian or by court order. If the parent/guardian refuses to consent to an extension beyond 10 consecutive school days and chooses not to participate, the meeting may be conducted without the parent/guardian's participation.
- 6. The IEP team shall consider the pre-expulsion assessment results and shall also review and consider the student's health records and school discipline records.
- 7. If the IEP team determines that the alleged misconduct was caused by, or was a direct manifestation of, the student's disability or that the student was not appropriately placed, the expulsion shall not proceed.
- 8. If the IEP team determines that the alleged misconduct was not caused by, or a direct manifestation of, the student's disability, and if it is determined that the student was appropriately placed, the student shall be subject to expulsion in accordance with procedures that apply to all students.
- 9. When expulsion is recommended, the IEP team should also recommend a potential rehabilitation plan for the student, if appropriate.

**Due Process and Expulsion Hearings** 

#### **STUDENTS**

If the parent/guardian disagrees with the decision of the IEP team, he/she has aright to a due process hearing conducted pursuant to United States Code, Title 20, Section 1415 or the Code of Federal Regulations, Title 34, Section 104.36.

Due process appeals must be initiated with 15 days of the decision of the IEP team.

The expulsion hearing shall not be conducted, and the 30-day expulsion proceedings time limit shall not commence, until after completion of:

- 1. The pre-expulsion assessment,
- The IEP team or school site committee meeting, and
- Due process hearings and appeals, if initiated.

The Board may expel a student with disability only if an IEP team has determined that 1) the misconduct was not caused by, or a direct manifestation of, the student's identified disability; and 2) the student was appropriately placed at the time the misconduct occurred.

#### **Services During Expulsion**

During the term of the expulsion, a special education student shall continue to be offered a program of appropriate educational services that is individually designed to meet his/her unique learning needs. Such services may include independent study, home instruction, or another appropriate alternative program.

The Board shall consider the recommendations of the IEP team when developing a rehabilitation plan for an expelled student with disability.

#### **Readmission**

Readmission procedures for students with disabilities shall parallel those used for all students. The Superintendent or designee may consider the input of the student's IEP team when developing recommendations to the Board regarding a request for readmission. Upon readmission, the IEP team meeting shall be convened to determine whether a new IEP or accommodation plan needs to be established.

#### **Suspension of Expulsion**

The Board's criteria for suspending the enforcement of an expulsion order shall be applied to students with disabilities just as they are applied to regular students.

#### **ALTERNATIVE LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES**

#### INDEPENDENT STUDY

The California Education Code requires that governing boards adopt educational alternative means for students to complete prescribed courses of study. The Board of Trustees authorizes independent study as an alternative means of meeting graduation requirements through an individual educational program for students whose needs may best be met outside of the regular classroom setting.

No student shall be required to participate in independent study.

No course required for high school graduation shall be offered exclusively through independent study.

In accordance with the law, the Board of Trustees authorizes the district superintendent to develop procedures to implement educational alternatives.

The Board of Trustees authorizes independent study as an optional alternative instructional strategy for students, including adult education students, whose needs may be best met through study outside of the regular classroom setting. Independent study shall offer a means of individualizing the educational plan and enabling students to reach curriculum objectives and fulfill graduation requirements. As necessary to meet student needs, independent study may be offered on a full-time basis or on a part-time basis in conjunction with part- or full-time classroom study.

The Superintendent or designee shall approve independent study for an individual student only upon determining that the student is prepared to meet the district's requirements for independent study and is likely to succeed in independent study as well as or better than he/she would in the regular classroom.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that a written independent study agreement, as prescribed by law, exists for each participating student.

To foster each participating student's success in independent study, the Board establishes the following maximum length of time which may elapse between the date an assignment is made and the date by which the student must complete the assigned work:

1. Three weeks for students in grades 9-12, continuation or adult education

When circumstances justify a longer time, the Superintendent or designee may extend the maximum length of an assignment to a period not to exceed eight weeks, pursuant to a written request with justification.

Supervising teachers should carefully set the duration of independent study assignments, within the limits specified above, and establish an appropriate schedule for student-teacher conferences in order to help identify students falling behind in their work or in danger of failing or dropping out of school. Except in unusual circumstances, it is expected that the supervising teacher will meet with each participating student at least once a week to discuss the student's progress.

INSTRUCTION 6141.1

When any participating student fails to complete four consecutive independent study assignments in a period of 15 school days, or misses two appointments with his/her supervising teacher without valid reasons, an evaluation shall be conducted to determine whether it is in the student's best interest to remain in independent study.

The Superintendent or designee shall annually report to the Board the number of students participating in independent study, the average daily attendance (ADA) generated for apportionment purposes, the quality of these students' work as measured by standard indicators, and the number and proportion of independent study students who graduate or successfully complete independent study.

# EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES / PROCEDURES FOR CONTRACT INDEPENDENT STUDY

Educational opportunities offered through independent study may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Special assignments extending the content of regular courses of instruction
- 2. Individualized study in a particular area of interest or in a subject not currently available in the regular school curriculum
- 3. Individualized alternative education designed to teach the knowledge and skills of the core curriculum
- 4. Continuing and special study during travel

No course required for high school graduation shall be offered exclusively through independent study.

#### **EQUIVALENCY**

The district's independent study option shall be substantially equivalent in quality and quantity to classroom instruction, thus enabling students participating in independent study to complete the district's adopted course of study within the customary time frame. Students in independent study shall have access to the same services and resources that are available to other students in the school.

The district shall not provide independent study students and their parents/guardians with funds or items of value that are not provided for other students and their parents/guardians.

#### **ELIGIBILITY FOR INDEPENDENT STUDY**

by means of independent study.

Parents/guardians of students who are interested in independent study should contact the principal or designee. Approval for participation shall be based on the following criteria:

- 1. Evidence that the student will work independently to complete the program
- 2. Availability of experienced certificated staff with adequate time to effectively supervise the student

A student's participation in independent study shall be voluntary.

Students participating in independent study must be residents of the local county or an adjacent county.

Full-time independent study shall not be available to students whose district residency status is based on their parent/guardian's employment within district boundaries pursuant to Education Code 48204.

A student with disabilities, as defined in Education Code 56026, shall not participate in independent study unless his/her individualized education program specifically provides for such participation.

A temporarily disabled student shall not receive individual instruction pursuant to Education Code 48206.3

No more than 10 percent of the students enrolled in a continuation high school or opportunity school or

program, not including pregnant and parenting students who are primary caregivers for one or more of their children, shall be in independent study at any given time. (Education Code 51745)

Students age 21 or older, and students age 19 or older who have not been continuously enrolled in school since their 18th birthday, may participate in independent study if offered, only through the adult education program for the purpose of enrolling in courses required for a high school diploma by Education Code 51225.3 or by the Board of Trustees.

#### **WRITTEN AGREEMENTS**

A written agreement shall be developed for each student participating in independent study for five or more school days.

The written independent study agreement for each participating student shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following:

- 1. The manner, frequency, time and place for submitting the student's assignments and for reporting his/her progress
- 2. The objectives and methods of study for the student's work, and the methods used to evaluate that work
- 3. The specific resources, including materials and personnel, that will be made available to the student
- 4. The Board's independent study policy describing the maximum length of time allowed between an assignment and its completion and the number of missed assignments which will trigger an evaluation of whether the student should be allowed to continue in independent study
- 5. The duration of the independent study agreement, including the beginning and ending dates for the student's participation in independent study under the agreement, with a maximum of one semester, or one-half year if the school is on a year-round calendar
- 6. A statement of the number of course credits to be earned by the student upon completion
- 7. A statement that independent study is an optional educational alternative in which no student may be required to participate
- 8. In the case of a student who is referred or assigned to any school, class or program pursuant to Education Code 48915 or 48917, a statement that instruction may be provided through independent study only if the student is offered the alternative of classroom instruction
- 9. A schedule for achieving objectives and completing the agreement and a schedule of conferences between the student and supervising teacher

The curriculum and methods of study specified in the written agreement shall be consistent with Board policy, administrative regulations and procedures for curriculum and instruction.

Before beginning the independent study, each written agreement shall be signed and dated by the student, the parent/guardian or caregiver of the student if the student is under age 18, the certificated employee designated as responsible for the general supervision of independent study, and all persons who have direct responsibility for providing assistance to the student.

The agreement shall state that the parent/guardian's signature confirms his/her permission for the student's

independent study as specified in the agreement.

#### STUDENT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Students participating in independent study shall continuously have the right to enter or return to the regular classroom mode of instruction, including upon termination of the agreement.

Independent study students who are late, miss scheduled conferences or do not submit assigned work on time shall not be reported as tardy or truant. However, the independent study administrator shall promptly and directly address any failure by the student to meet the terms of his/her written agreement. The following supportive strategies may be used:

- 1. A letter to the student and/or parent/guardian
- 2. A meeting between the student and the teacher and/or counselor
- 3. A meeting between the student and the independent study administrator, including the parent/guardian if appropriate
- 4. An increase in the amount of time the student works under direct supervision

When the student has missed the number of assignments specified in Board policy and the written independent study agreement as precipitating an evaluation, the Superintendent or designee shall conduct an evaluation which may result in termination of the independent study agreement and the student's return to a regular classroom or alternative instructional program.

#### ADMINISTRATION OF INDEPENDENT STUDY

Each student's independent study shall be coordinated, evaluated and carried out under the general supervision of a certificated employee.

The responsibilities of the independent study administrator shall be to:

- 1. Ensure that the district's independent study option is operated in accordance with law, Board policy and administrative regulation
- 2. Approve the participation of students requesting independent study
- 3. Facilitate the completion of written independent study agreements
- 4. Approve all credits earned through independent study and forward the information to the appropriate staff so that the information becomes part of the student's record
- 5. Authorize the selection of staff to be assigned to supervise independent study
- 6. Supervise any staff assigned to independent study functions who are not regularly supervised by another administrator
- 7. Complete or coordinate the preparation of all necessary records and reports
- 8. Establish and maintain in a systematic manner all records required by law, Board policy and administrative regulation

9. Monitor student participation in independent study so that the district stays within prescribed limits and income to the district is maximized

- 10. Develop and manage the budget for independent study
- 11. Obtain and maintain current information and skills required for the operation of an independent study strategy that meets established standards for the district's educational programs
- 12. Assure a smooth transition into and out of the independent study mode of instruction
- 13. Prepare and submit reports as required by the Board or Superintendent

#### **SUPERVISING TEACHERS**

The principal may recommend and the independent study administrator shall approve the assignment of teachers to directly supervise independent study. The teacher may be the student's regular classroom teacher.

The ratio of students to full-time equivalent certificated employees responsible for independent study shall not exceed the equivalent ratio for all other education programs in the district.

The teacher supervising independent study shall:

- 1. Complete designated portions of the written independent study agreement and add additional information to the written agreement when appropriate
- 2. Supervise and approve coursework
- 3. Design all lesson plans and assignments
- 4. Assess all student work and determine and assign grades or other approved measures of achievement
- 5. Personally judge the time value of assigned work or work products completed and submitted by the student
- 6. Select and save with each agreement representative samples of the student's completed and evaluated assignments on not less than a monthly basis, preferably biweekly, and signed or initialed and dated in accordance with item #3 in the section on "Records" below
- 7. Sign and complete the agreement when the student has reached his/her objectives or the agreement is terminated
- 8. Maintain a daily or hourly attendance register in accordance with item #4 in the section on "Records" below
- 9. Maintain any other required records and files on a current basis

#### **RECORDS**

For audit purposes, the Superintendent or designee shall maintain the following records:

1. A copy of the Board policy, administrative regulation, and other procedures related to independent study

2. A separate listing of the students by grade level, program and school, who have participated in independent study, identifying course credits attempted by and awarded to students in grades 9-12 as specified in their written agreements

- 3. A file of all agreements, with representative samples of each student's work products bearing the supervising teacher's signed or initialed and dated notations indicating that he/she has personally evaluated the work or that he/she has personally reviewed the evaluations made by another certificated teacher
- 4. A daily or hourly attendance register, as appropriate to the program in which the students are participating, separate from classroom attendance records, and maintained on a current basis as time values of student work products are personally judged by a certificated teacher, and reviewed by the supervising teacher if they are two different persons

The Superintendent or designee also shall maintain a record of grades and other evaluations issued to each student for independent study assignments.

Each school shall maintain records for the students at that school.

A written record of the findings of any evaluation conducted after the student has missed the number of assignments specified in Board policy shall be treated as a mandatory interim student record which shall be maintained for three years from the date of the evaluation.

#### PROCEDURES FOR CONTRACT INDEPENDENT STUDY

#### I.General Regulations

When it appears to be in his/her best interests, a student may voluntarily elect to participate in educational alternative of independent study. Such a placement requires the signed mutual consent and agreement of a certificated employee of the school, the parents or responsible adults, and the pupil. Independent study must conform to the following:

- A.Each school principal shall act as or appoint a credentialed staff member to act as supervisor of independent study.

  The responsibility of the supervisor will be to monitor the program and maintain communication with the instructor(s) who are in regular student contact. The instructor(s) may or may not be credentialed.
- B.The ratio of ADA of pupils eighteen years of age or less in independent study to school district full-time equivalent employees responsible for independent study shall not exceed the equivalent ratio for all other education programs operated by a school district.
- C.Each independent study contract must be agreed upon and signed by the student, the parents, or responsible

adults, the principal/supervisor, the certificated instructor, and/or the non-certificated instructor.

- \* No student may be required to participate involuntarily -in independent study.
- D.Each student on an independent study contract must be enrolled in a minimum school day (240 minutes per day or an average of 240 minutes per day over a 10 school day period). The minimum day may be met on campus, off campus, or by a combination of both.
- E.Independent study must adhere to the district's regular procedures and timelines for adding and dropping courses.
- F.Independent study courses must be completed within a twentyweek period (usually by the end of a semester). Students receiving incomplete grades will have an additional quarter to make up the required work.
- G.Students who request Independent study may elect to earn a letter grade (A,B,C,D,E,F) or a pass/fail grade. Students who fail to complete an independent study contract and who do not "drop" the contract within the established time limits will receive a failing grade or an incomplete grade if approved by the principal. If an incomplete grade is given, the certificated instructor must file an incomplete form with the contract at the end of the grading period.
- H.No individual with exceptional needs, as defined in Education Code Section 56026, may participate in independent study unless his/her individualized education program specifically provides for such participation.
- I.When any student misses four consecutive independent study assignment meetings, an evaluation of progress in independent study will be conducted to determine if he/she will be allowed to continue.
- J.Each school shall maintain an independent study records file that shall include a copy of all of the contracts being attempted by students of that school. This file should be organized in such a manner that the names of participating students are easily obtainable.
- K.At the conclusion of each contract (successful or unsuccessful), the appropriate information including grades and credit will be recorded on the permanent

record and the original (copy 1) contract filed in the cum folder.

L.In cases of disputed credit, the student or the family may make an appeal to the superintendent.

#### II.Definition, Objectives, and Scope

#### A. Definition of Terms:

- 1. Independent Study: Adult apportionments for independent study students 21 years of age or older, and pupils 19 years of age or older who have not been continuously enrolled in k 12 education since their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday shall be restricted to coursework that meets requirements for a high school diploma.
- 2. Principal/Supervisor: The principal of the school or any certificated staff member assigned the responsibility to supervise students engaged in independent study. The supervisor may also act as the certificated instructor.
- 3.Certificated Instructor: Any certificated employee of the district who oversees the direct supervision of a student on an independent study. The certificated instructor must be credentialed in the area of study.
- 4. Non Certificated Instructor: Any person (including a parent) qualified to provide systematic direction, coaching or teaching in a subject approved for independent study. The non-certificated instructor must be under the direct supervision of a certificated instructor and/or a principal/supervisor credentialed in the area of study.
- 5. Student: A student enrolled in grades 7 12 in any school in the district. Note: In a continuation school a maximum of ten percent (10%) of the total school enrollment may be enrolled in independent study.
- 6. Adult: The definition of adult in this context is 21 years of age or older, or 19 years of age or older who have not been continuously enrolled in kindergarten or any grades 1 to 12, inclusive, since their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday.

- B. Objectives: There are times when it is in a student's best interest to include in his/her program independent study in addition to, or instead of, educational alternative regular course assignments. The Board recognizes the need to provide educational alternative opportunities for independent study as part of the district's instructional program.
- C.Scope: An individual student or group of students may engage in independent study on or off campus during the regular school day. Independent study may be undertaken (1) as part of a regularly scheduled class, under general supervision of the instructor; or (2) as a separately scheduled activity under general supervision of a certificated employee of the district. When appropriate, independent study may be substituted for one or more regularly scheduled classes.

#### III.Purposes Served by Independent Study Contracts

Independent study provides students with an additional option for the pursuit of educational goals. Examples of the purposes which independent study may serve for students are:

- A.to provide students with self-directed learning opportunities during an extended family vacation.
- B.To provide opportunities for the pursuit of special or unique educational interests on an independent, school supervised basis.
- C.To provide alternatives and individual guidance for students who have experienced difficulty in adapting to the regular curriculum.
- D.To provide additional flexibility for students with serious scheduling problems.
- E.To provide exceptionally gifted students with in depth opportunities leading to state, regional and national competition.
- F.To provide students with special medical or other handicapping problems with alternatives to meeting normal education requirements.

#### IV. Guidelines for Approval of Enrollment

Evaluation of requests from students for approval of independent

study and enrollment in the program will be subject to the
following guidelines:

- A.Application for enrollment in the program must be made on an individual basis using the independent study contract form.
- B.Applications will be screened and approved by a \*site committee (the committee is not required to convene as a body) consisting of the following personnel: 1) student's counselor, 2) principal/supervisor, 3) certificated and/or non-certificated instructor.
- C.Criteria for approval of applications include the following:
  - 1. Evidence that the applicant can work independently.
  - 2.Evidence of likelihood that the proposed program will be pursued diligently to completion.
  - 3.Availability of certificated staff member with adequate time to supervise the student effectively.
  - 4.An acceptable written statement of educational objectives and competencies and the means of achieving them.
  - 5.Evidence that the student's activity in the program will approximate the amount of time devoted to the course in the classroom at the site granting credit.
- \* IMPORTANT Applications for programs not specifically listed in the district's Board adopted course of study must be approved by the assistant superintendent/instruction in addition to the members of the site committee.
- V. Independent Study Contract Provisions
  - A.The title and a statement of the major objectives of the district course undertaken.
  - B.The name, birthdate, and grade level of the student.
  - C.A well-defined list describing the major activities and specific resources including study materials and personnel which will be made available to the student.
  - D.The manner in which achievement of objectives and

#### competencies will be evaluated.

- E.The manner, time, frequency and place for submitting assignments and for reporting progress.
- F.A listing of the expected time requirements for achieving each of the objectives and completing the study contract.
- G.A description of the methods for obtaining the individual assistance or tutoring required to achieve course objectives.
- H.A tentative schedule of conferences between student and supervising teacher.
- I.A copy of adopted Board Policy describing how many missed assignments triggers an evaluation of whether the student should continue in independent study.
- J.A statement of the number of course credits to be earned.
- K.Agreement to the contract evidenced by the signature of the student, the student's parent or legal guardian for minor students, the student's counselor, the principal/supervisor, the certificated instructor, and/or non-certificated instructor.

#### VI.Record Keeping

#### A.School Level

Record keeping shall be the responsibility of the principal and shall include, but not be limited to:

- 1.A file of independent study contracts in progress.
- 2.A list of students participating in current independent study contracts specifying the grade level.
- 3. The number of contracts attempted for the current year.
- 4.The number of students successfully completing a contract in the current year.

- 5.The number of course credits completed, including the titles of the courses undertaken during the current year, providing a separate attendance register from other attendance records.
- 6.Necessary attendance records following the San Dieguito Union High School District attendance accounting procedures.
- 7. In addition, each school will keep a cumulative record for the above information for all previous years.

B.District Level (Assistant Superintendent/Instruction)

District records shall include, but not be limited to:

1.A current list of independent study students and the type of contract for each student.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Board of Trustees adopted budgets on June 30, 2009, for 2009-10. Since that time the General Fund has been presented four times, (Fall Revision, First Interim, Second Interim, and Spring Revision). Special Funds were reviewed in May and June 2009, before adoption of the 2009-10 budgets. This agenda item provides a comparison of the 2009-10 Spring Revision to the unaudited actuals.

While the District's Basic Aid status did not change throughout the year as it did in 2008-09, the details of the "Fair Share Proposal" and the status of the State Fiscal Stabilization Funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act necessitated major budget changes. After the Spring Revision budget was presented in May, the District was notified that the majority of the Federal Stimulus Funds would need to be repaid, due to the state's re-calculation. That repayment is reflected in the final 2009-10 Unaudited Actual Income and Expenditure report.

The following attachments are included:

- Attachment A This shows a comparison for 2009-10 between the General Fund Spring Budget Revision and Unaudited Actual balances for income, expenditures and the ending fund balance. The unrestricted ending balance for 2009-10 [and the beginning balance for 2010-11] has increased by \$1.4 Million.
- Attachment B This shows the same comparison as Attachment A, for all the Special Funds of the district.
- Attachment C A copy of the full SACS report.

With this certification the Board accepts the actual income and expenses before the annual audit is performed.

Behind Attachment A are two pages which give a brief narrative about the variances from Spring Revision to Unaudited actuals. Although the unrestricted General Fund reflects an increase to the ending balance, the ending balance for the restricted General Fund decreased by \$2.5 Million. For 2009-10, the ending balance includes a reserve for the donation carryover amount of \$778,228.

#### Significant changes:

#### Revenue Limit/Property Tax

Property tax decreased by \$900K, as previously reported to the Board.

#### Federal Income

A significant decrease in Federal Income is shown due to the repayment of State Fiscal Stabilization Fund (SFSF) dollars.

#### Local Income

Local Income increased \$540K, primarily from donations, college testing fees, and interest income. This revenue is typically unbudgeted and booked as it is received. The ending balance reflects a reserve for the carryover amounts in these categories which will increase expenditure budgets at Fall Revision.

#### Transfers

The increase in revenue transfers is due to accounting changes by the State and is offset by expenses in the "Other Outgo" category. This accounting change results in no increase or decrease to the General Fund.

#### Encroachment

The contribution for Special Ed decreased by \$447K as the District took advantage of the Federal Stimulus funds for Special Ed. The Federal regulations allowed for these funds to be used to help offset the encroachment to the general fund for 2009-10 only. The District had included this in the budget; but, during the year end closing process, it was determined that an additional \$447K could be transferred.

#### Certificated Salaries

Certificated salaries exceed budget, primarily in substitute teacher costs, counselor extra work day salaries and test proctors.

#### Classified Salaries

Classified salaries exceed budget. Additional Instructional Assistants needed during second semester, as well as campus supervisors, test proctoring and extra help were partially offset by savings in classified support salaries.

#### Benefits

The Benefits category reflects increases based on additional certificated and classified salaries.

#### Books and Supplies

An additional \$2.8M was saved compared to our projections at Spring Revision. However, \$1.6M is from restricted sources and some of this savings will be included in the 2010-11 budget as carryover. The unrestricted savings of \$1.2M included \$778K in donation carryover that will also be included in the 2010-11 budget at Fall Revision.

#### Services and Operating Expenses

Savings in the Services and Operating Expenses were primarily in District utilities due to implemented conservation strategies.

#### Other Outgo

State changes in accounting due to the increased flexibility legislation, created additional income in transfers and an offset in expenses shown in other outgo. These transfers reflect the balances available at the beginning of the 2009-10 year in the Adult Education and Deferred Maintenance Funds. These amounts remained and were spent in those funds as planned.

#### Components of the Ending Balance

The District has met the Board's requirement of maintaining a 4.5% reserve. The Reserve for Economic Uncertainties is 4.7%. The District is maintaining the 3% Basic Aid Reserve as well as reserving \$778K for carryover amounts in the unrestricted General Fund that will be reflected in the 2010-11 budget.

These reserves will be necessary to preserve programs in light of the dramatic reductions in state categorical funding to Basic Aid districts forecasted for the 2010-2011 year. Although, the State has yet to pass a budget for 2010-11, the "Fair Share Deal" for 2009-10 included further reductions to Tier III revenues in 2010-11.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Board certify the 2009-10 Unaudited Actual Income and Expenditures.

Where federal or state program guidelines required that the LEA charge an employee's normal separation costs to an unrestricted resource rather than to the restricted program in which the employee worked, the LEA may identify and enter these costs on Line A for inclusion in the indirect cost pool.

Abnormal or mass separation costs are those costs resulting from actions taken by an LEA to influence employees to terminate their employment earlier than they normally would have. Abnormal or mass separation costs include retirement incentives such as a Golden Handshake or severance packages negotiated to effect termination. Abnormal or mass separation costs may not be charged to federal programs as either direct costs or indirect costs. Where an LEA paid abnormal or mass separation costs on behalf of positions in general administrative functions included in the indirect cost pool, the LEA must identify and enter these costs on Line B for exclusion from the pool.

#### A. **Normal Separation Costs (optional)**

#### Part IV - Carry-forward Adjustment

The carry-forward adjustment is an after-the-fact adjustment for the difference between indirect costs recoverable using the indirect cost rate approved for use in a given year, and the actual indirect costs incurred in that year. The carry-forward adjustment eliminates the need for LEAs to file amended federal reports when their actual indirect costs vary from the estimated indirect costs on which the approved rate was based.

Where the ratio of indirect costs incurred in the current year is less than the estimated ratio of indirect costs on which the approved rate for use in the current year was based, the carry-forward adjustment is limited by using either the approved rate times current year base costs, or the highest rate actually used to recover costs from any program times current year base costs, if the highest rate used was less than the approved rate. Rates used to recover costs from programs are displayed in Exhibit A.

- 1.2. Examine academic issues related to articulating between elementary, middle and high school

#### 1.2.1. Academic Articulation

Associate Superintendent of Educational Services will continue to host meetings with elementary Associate Superintendents to discuss curricular issues that impact the high school district. Areas of focus for 2010-2011 are:

- Math sequencing Continue to ensure incoming middle school students are best prepared to successfully complete algebra in the eighth grade. Will provide elementary districts Algebra Honors Readiness Test results disaggregated by 7<sup>th</sup> grade math standards
- Identifying literacy skills necessary to be successful in core academics
- Develop processes between districts for improving the identification, monitoring and reclassification of long-term English Learners
- 1.2.2. Vertical alignment of curriculum between middle school and high school
  - Through the process of identifying essential learning and performance objectives for each subject, departments will establish written curriculum and performance expectations between middle school and high school as well as performance expectations between subject levels

- Middle and high school teachers who teach sequential courses will use scheduled collaboration time to identify the content knowledge and essential skills necessary to be successful at the next level
- 1.2.3. Provide school sites funding for staff development/collaboration time to create and align curriculum
  - Department chairs and principals will establish monthly collaboration meetings
  - Educational Services will continue to fund teacher release time to focus on identifying essential learning outcomes and performance objectives, developing common assessments, analyzing assessment results, and developing interventions to provide support to all students.

    - Implement common site-based assessments throughout the school year in all academic subjects. This may be in the form of common end-of-unit assessments, quarterly (or periodic) assessments, or common questions used by all teachers embedded into regularly scheduled tests
  - 2.2.3. The principal and department chairs will schedule collaboration time for the school year by the end of the second week of school. Collaboration time will focus on developing common assessments, analyzing assessments results for each student and developing interventions to support underperforming students.

- The Educational Services department will provide funding for collaboration time not built into the existing bell schedule. Each Principal will be responsible for submitting a budget to the Executive Director of Curriculum and Assessment requesting funds to support staff collaboration
- 2.3. Create intervention programs focusing on developing math and literacy skills
  - 2.3.1. Train Pre-algebra Essentials, Algebra Readiness, and resource teachers to use PLATO math intervention by the end of September 2010
  - 2.3.2. Train English, English Language Development and resource teachers to use READ 180 and System 44 by the end of September 2010
  - 2.3.3. Implement writing development/intervention web-based tool for English support classes and as a tool for students to use in English classes by January 2011
  - 2.3.4. Based on a history of grades and standardized testing results, counselors will enroll students in intervention programs
  - 2.3.5. Executive Director of Curriculum will ensure math and English intervention programs are provided equitably across the district
- 2.4. Establish high performance expectations for all levels of classes
  - 2.4.1. Continue to align learning and performance objectives in college prep, honors and advanced placement courses such that the curriculum within a subject is consistent from teacher to teacher
  - 2.4.2. Teachers within subjects will identify and agree on the content to be covered, the skills students will be able to demonstrate and a consistent way to measure student results
  - 2.4.3. Continue to ensure the curriculum of academic support programs (e.g. AVID, Academic Literacy, Study Island) align directly with content covered in core content areas

  - 3.4.3. Results from state testing will be used to set achievement goals for all students and subgroups. Each school's Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA) will include these goals. SPSA action plans will address the resources, programs and personnel necessary to achieve these academic goals
- 3.5. Use data to monitor student progress in academic core and intervention programs
  - 3.5.1. Academic performance reports from Data Director, PLATO and READ 180 will be reviewed regularly. The results will be used to assess the effectiveness of each intervention program. Additionally, the results from common formative assessments will be used as a way to measure student progress. Interventions in support programs will be implemented based on the needs of each student.
  - 3.5.2. Integrate more assessment information in Data Director to give teachers and administrators the ability to create reports with local, state and national assessment data. Examples of information to be added are Advanced Placement, SAT/ACT, attendance and disciplinary information
  - 3.5.3. Automate the Data Director update process to provide real time data

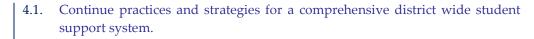

Students will use their computer knowledge and skills to:

- Prepare for careers by using classroom, media center, and counseling center computers to complete on-line college searches, admission, and scholarship applications.
- Use career aptitude software to investigate and prepare for careers; to communicate via email with business and community partners.
- Participate in virtual job searches and field trips.
- Develop personal resumes and electronic portfolios.
- Complete on-line resumes and job applications.
- 5.4. The SDUHSD will continue to maintain and revise its current Acceptable Use Policy (AUP). The policy has been divided into two sections- one for staff and the other for students. The policy outlines the rules for acceptable use and guides staff and student users in all forms of electronic usage and communication.
  - 5.4.1. Provide all incoming 7th grade students an awareness of safe, secure, legal and ethical use of the Internet, and other forms of electronic communication. This is reinforced again in 8th grade and again throughout high school. As our digital learners grow and spend more time using the district's technology resources, all sites will expand the training for ethical and fair use.
  - 5.4.2. The District will develop a Digital Citizenship curriculum. This curriculum will be delivered to each incoming 7th grader and reinforced throughout the middle schools and high schools. The key components of the digital citizenship curriculum will be: etiquette, communication, literacy, access, commerce, legal issues, rights and responsibilities, health and wellness, safety, and security.
- 5.5. The SDUHSD recognizes the need to make data driven decisions regarding student achievement. All teachers and administrators will use Aeries and the new Data Director program to analyze data, create formative assessments, and make data driven decisions based on this information. Once identified, students will receive intervention and support strategies designed to meet their specific needs.
- 5.6. Continue to implement a staff development program focusing on the continuation of improving technological proficiency for the novice, basic, intermediate, and experienced staff members.

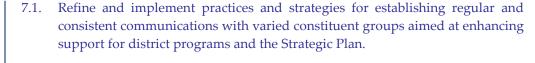

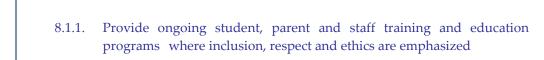

# **STUDENTS**

#### **DISTRICT RESIDENCY**

The Board of Trustees shall admit only those students who provide proof of District residency. Such proof shall be required prior to enrollment.

A student may establish residency by documenting that he/she lives with a parent/guardian within the District, that he/she is an emancipated minor living in the District, that he/she is a participant in a recognized student exchange program living with a District resident, or that he/she is in the court-appointed care of a licensed foster home, family home, or children's institution within the District or that he/she lives in the home of a care-giving adult within the District. Students placed by the parent/guardian into a properly licensed home shall also qualify as District residents. Any person providing such a home shall furnish proof of current licensure or state why a license is not required under the law.

A student not residing within the District shall be deemed a District resident if an interdistrict attendance agreement is in effect or if the student is confined to a District area hospital or residential care facility for treatment of a temporary disability.

The District is currently in a Basic Aid funding status. Until which time the District is no longer in this funding status, the District will not accept any new interdistrict attendance permits.

District residency may also be granted to an elementary grade student (K-8) not residing in the District if the student's parent/ guardian works within the District boundaries. Proof of such employment shall be required prior to enrollment and may be required subsequently at regular intervals determined by the Superintendent or designee.

Before admission is granted on an interdistrict permit, the Board shall review each proposed enrollment and determine whether it would result in additional costs to the District in excess of state funds. If the Board determines that excess costs would be incurred by the District, the student may be denied admission. Any proposed enrollment which would overcrowd District schools or would adversely affect an existing desegregation plan of any involved District may also be grounds for denial of admission.

Unless approved by the student's current district of attendance, no student shall be admitted into the District on the basis of a parent/guardian place of employment in excess of the limits imposed by law for such transfers.

The Superintendent is authorized to develop administrative regulations implementing the Board policy on District residency.

#### ABSENCES AND EXCUSES

The Board of Trustees believes that regular attendance plays a key role in student achievement. The Board recognizes its responsibility under the law to ensure that students attend school regularly. Parents/guardians of children aged six-6 to 18 are obligated to send their children to school unless otherwise provided by law. The Board shall abide by all state attendance laws and may use appropriate legal means to correct the problems of excessive absence or truancy.

#### **EXCUSED ABSENCES**

Absence from school shall be excused only for health reasons, family emergencies and justifiable personal reasons, as permitted by law, Board policy and administrative regulations.

Insofar as class participation is an integral part of students' learning experiences, parents/-guardians and students shall be encouraged to schedule medical appointments during non-school hours.

At the beginning of each academic year, notifications shall be sent to the parents/guardians of all students and to all students in grades 7 through 12, informing them that school authorities may excuse any student from school to obtain confidential medical services without the consent of the student's parent/guardian.

Students should not be absent from school without their parent/guardian's knowledge or consent except in cases of medical emergency or confidential medical appointment.

Student absence for religious instruction or participation in religious exercises away from school property may be considered excused subject to administrative regulations and law.

#### **ABSENCE FOR RELIGIOUS PURPOSES**

Pupils, with the written consent of their parents or guardians, may be excused from school in order to participate in religious exercises or to receive moral and religious instruction at their respective places of worship, or at other suitable place or places away from school property designated by the religious group, church, or denomination, which shall be in addition and supplementary to the instruction in manners and morals required by the Education Code. Students complying with the following regulations shall not be deemed absent in computing the average daily attendance:

- 1. Written request from the parent must be made at least one (1) day in advance of the anticipated absence.
- 2. Requests to be excused from school under this policy must be clearly labeled and include the length of the anticipated absence and the amount of instruction that the student is to receive each day while absent from school.
- 3. Each pupil excused under provisions of this policy shall attend school at least the minimum school day for students of his/her grade level as defined in the Education Code.
- 4. No pupil shall be excused from school for such purposes on more than four (4) days per school month.

#### **UNEXCUSED ABSENCES/TRUANCY**

The Superintendent or designee shall implement positive steps to reduce truancy, such as communication with parents/guardians and the use of student study teams.

The District participates in the county school attendance review board as allowed by law in order to meet the special needs of students with school attendance or school behavior problems.

Students who are habitual truants or habitually insubordinate or disorderly during attendance at school may be referred to the county probation department.

When the student's attendance problems cannot be resolved or the student and parent/guardian have failed to respond to directives to correct the problem, a student who has been classified as truant may be referred to the district attorney or probation office for truancy mediation.

When the student's attendance problems cannot be resolved or the student and parent/guardian have failed to respond to directives to correct the problem, the school attendance review board or probation office may ask the County Superintendent of Schools to request a juvenile court petition on behalf of the student.

A student's grades may be affected by excessive unexcused absences in accordance with Board policy.

#### ABSENCES AND EXCUSES

#### **EXCUSED ABSENCES**

A student's absence shall be excused for the following reasons:

- 1. Personal illness.
- 2. Quarantine under the direction of a county or city health officer.
- 3. Medical, dental, optometrical, or chiropractic appointments.
- 4. Attendance at funeral services for a member of the immediate family.
  - a. Excused absence in this instance shall be limited to one day if the service is conducted in California or three days if the service is conducted out of state.
  - b. "Immediate family" shall be defined as mother, father, grandmother, grandfather, spouse, son/son in-law, daughter-in-law, brother, sister or any relative living in the student immediate household.
- 5. Jury duty in the manner provided by law.
- 6. Participation in religious instruction or exercises or to receive moral and religious instruction in accordance with district policy. In such instances:
  - a. Written request from the parent/guardian must be made in advance of the anticipated absence.
  - b. The student shall attend at least the minimum school day.
  - bc. The student shall be excused for this purpose on no more than four school days per month.
- 7. The illness or medical appointment during school hours of a child to whom the student is the custodial parent.
- 8. Service as a member of a precinct board for an election pursuant to Elections Code 12302.
- 9. In addition, a student's absence shall be excused for justifiable personal reasons. Upon Aadvance written requests by the parent/guardian and approval by the principal or designee, justifiable personal reasons including, but not limited to: shall be required for absences such as:
  - 4a. Appearance in court.
  - 2b. Attendance at a funeral service.
  - 3c. Observation of a holiday or ceremony of his/her religion.
  - 4d. Attendance at religious retreats for no more than four hours during a semester.
  - 5e. Attendance at Employment interview or conference.
  - f. Attendance at an educational conference on the legislative or judicial process offered by a nonprofit organization.
  - 6. When the student is the custodial parent of a child who is ill or has a medical appointment during school hours.

#### METHOD OF VERIFICATION

When students who have been absent return to school, they must present a satisfactory explanation verifying explaining the reason for the absence. The following methods may be used to verify student absences:

- 1. Written note, fax, or email from parent/guardian, parent representative, or student if 18 or older.
- 2. Conversation, in person or by telephone, between the verifying employee and the student's parent/guardian or parent representative. The employee shall subsequently record the following:
  - a. Name of student.
  - b. Name of parent/guardian or parent representative.
  - c. Name of verifying employee.
  - d. Date or dates of absence.
  - e. Reason for absence.
- 3. Visit to the student's home by the verifying employee, or any other reasonable method that establishes the fact that the student was actually absent for the reasons stated. A written recording shall be made, including information outlined above.

#### 4. PHYSICIAN'S VERIFICATION

a. confidential medical appointments by the student's physician. When excusing students for confidential medical services or verifying such appointments, district staff shall not ask the purpose of such appointments but may contact a medical office to confirm the time of the appointment.

When a student has had 14 absences in the school year for illness verified by methods listed in #1-#3 above, any further absences for illness must be verified by a physician.

#### STUDENT RECORDS

#### **Definitions**

"Mandatory permanent student records" are those records which are maintained in perpetuity and which schools have been directed to compile by state law, regulation or administrative directive. (5 CCR 430)

"<u>Mandatory interim student records</u>" are those records which the schools are directed to compile and maintain for stipulated periods of time and are then destroyed in accordance with state law, regulation or administrative directive. (5 CCR 430)

"<u>Permitted student records</u>" are those records having clear importance only to the current educational process of the student. (5 CCR 430)

"<u>Parent</u>" means a natural parent, adoptive parent, or legal guardian. If parents are divorced or legally separated, only a parent having legal custody of the student may challenge the content of a record, offer a written response to a record, or consent to release records to others. Either parent may grant consent if both parents notify the district, in writing, that such an agreement has been made.

Once a student reaches the age of 18 or attends a post secondary school, he/she alone shall exercise these rights and grant consent for release of records.

"<u>Personally identifiable information</u>" includes but is not limited to the student's name, the name of the student's parent or other family member, the address of the student or student's family, a personal identifier such as the student's social security number or student number, a list of personal characteristics or other information that would make the student's identity easily traceable.

"<u>Disclosure</u>" means to permit access to or the release, transfer, or other communication of personally identifiable information contained in education records, to any party, by any means including oral, written or electronic means.

Student means any individual who is or has been in attendance at the district and regarding whom the district maintains student records. (34 CFR 99.3)

Attendance includes, but is not limited to, attendance in person or by paper correspondence, videoconference, satellite, Internet, or other electronic information and telecommunication technologies for students who are not physically present in the classroom, and the period during which a person is working under a work-study program. (34 CFR 99.3)

"Student Record" means Student records are any items of information, (in handwriting, print, tape, film, computer, or other medium) gathered within or outside the district that are other than directory information, directly related to an identifiable student and maintained by the district, or required to be maintained by a schoolan employee in the performance of his/her duties, or maintained by a party acting for the district. Any information maintained for the purpose of second-party review is considered a student record. whether recorded in handwriting, print, tapes, film, microfilm or by other means. The student record Student records shall include the student's health record. (34 CFR 99.3; Education Code 49061, 49062; 5 CCR 430)

"Student Record" shallStudent records do not include: (34 CFR 99.3; Education Code 49061, 49062; 5

STUDENTS 5125 / AR-1

CCR 430) informal notes about a student which a school employee keeps for private use and are not revealed to any other person except a substitute.

- 1. Directory information (cf. 5125.1 Release of Directory Information)
- Informal notes compiled by a school officer or employee which remain in the sole possession of the maker, are used only as a personal memory aid, and are not accessible or revealed to any other person except a substitute
- 3. Records of the law enforcement unit of the district, subject to the provisions of 34 CFR 99.8 (cf. 3515 Campus Security) (cf. 3515.3 District Police/Security Department)
- 4. Records created or received by the district after an individual is no longer a student in attendance and that are not directly related to the individual's attendance as a student
- 5. Grades on peer-graded papers before they are collected and recorded by a teacher

"Student Record" means information relative to a student gathered within or outside-the district. Any information maintained for the purpose of second party review is considered a student record.

"Adult student" means a person who is or was enrolled in school and who is at least 18 years of age.

"Eligible student" means a person 16 years or older or who has completed grade ten.

"School officials and employees" are members of the Board of Trustees, district certificated employees and district administrators.

A "<u>legitimate educational interest</u>" is one held by officials and employees whose duties and responsibilities to the district require that they have access to student records.

"Mandatory Permanent Student Records are those records which are maintained in perpetuity and which schools have been directed to compile by state law, regulation, or administrative directive. (5 CCR 430)," which shall be kept indefinitely, include:

- 1. Legal name of student.
- 2. Date and place of birth.
- 3. Method of verification of birth date.
- 4. Sex of student.
- 5. Name and address of parent of minor student.
  - a. Address of minor student if different from the above.
  - b. Annual verification of parent's name and address and student's residence.
- 6. Entering and leaving date of each school year.
- 7. Subjects taken during each year, half-year, summer session or quarter, and marks or grades ——given.
- 8. Verification of required immunizations or waiver.
- 9. Date of high school graduation or equivalent.

STUDENTS 5125 / AR-1

"Mandatory Interim Student Records," are those records which the schools are directed to compile and maintain for stipulated periods of time and are then destroyed in accordance with state law, regulation, or administrative directive. (5 CCR 430) Unless forwarded to another district, mandatory interim student records shall be maintained subject to destruction during the third school year following a determination that their usefulness has ceased and the student has left the district. These records include: (Education Code 48918, 5 CCR 432, 437, 16027)

- A log identifying persons or agencies who request or receive information from the student record. Log shall be accessible only to the legal parent or guardian, eligible student, dependent adult student, adult student or custodian of records.
- Health information, including Child Health and Disability Prevention Program verification or waiver.
- 3. Information on participation in special education programs, including required tests, case studies, authorizations, and evidence of eligibility for admission or discharge.
- 4. Language training records.
- 5. Progress slips/notices required by Education Code 49066 and 49067.
- 6. Parental restrictions/stipulations regarding access to directory information.
- 7. Parent or adult student rejoinders to challenged records and to disciplinary action.
- 8. Parental authorization or denial of student participation in specific programs.
- 9. Results of standardized tests given within the past three years.
- 10. Expulsion orders and the causes therefor.

Permitted student Records are those records having clear importance only to the current educational process of the student. (5 CCR 430)may be destroyed six months after the student completes or withdraws from the educational program including: (5 CCR 432, 437)

- 1. Objective counselor/teacher ratings.
- 2. Routine disciplinary data.
- 3. All disciplinary notices.
- 4. Verified reports of relevant behavior patterns.
- 5. Standardized test results older than three years.
- 6. Supplementary attendance records.

"Access" means a personal inspection and review of a record, an accurate copy of a record, or receipt of an accurate copy of a record, an oral description or communication of a record, and a request to release a copy of any record. (Education Code 49061)

Disclosure means to permit access to, or the release, transfer, or other communication of, personally identifiable information contained in education records to any party, except the party that provided or created the record, by any means including oral, written, or electronic. (34 CFR 99.3)

STUDENTS 5125 / AR-1

Personally identifiable information includes, but is not limited to: (34 CFR 99.3)

- 1. The student's name
- 2. The name of the student's parent/guardian or other family members
- 3. The address of the student or student's family
- 4. A personal identifier, such as the student's social security number, student number, or biometric record (e.g., fingerprints, retina and iris patterns, voiceprints, DNA sequence, facial characteristics, and handwriting)
- 5. Other indirect identifiers, such as the student's date of birth, place of birth, and mother's maiden name
- 6. Other information that, alone or in combination, is linked or linkable to a specific student that would allow a reasonable person in the school community, who does not have personal knowledge of the relevant circumstances, to identify the student with reasonable certainty
- 7. Information requested by a person who the district reasonably believes knows the identity of the student to whom the student record relates

Adult student is a person who is or was enrolled in school and who is at least 18 years of age. (5 CCR 430)

Parent/guardian means a natural parent, an adopted parent, legal guardian, surrogate parent, or foster parent. (Education Code 49061, 56050, 56055)

School officials and employees are officials or employees whose duties and responsibilities to the district, whether routine or as a result of special circumstances, require that they have access to student records. School officials and employees include contractors, consultants, volunteers, or other parties to whom the district has outsourced district functions and who perform services for which the district would otherwise use employees.

A legitimate educational interest is one held by school officials and employees whose duties and responsibilities to the district, whether routine or as a result of special circumstances, require that they have access to student records.

Custodian of records is the employee responsible for the security of student records maintained by the district and for devising procedures for assuring that access to such records is limited to authorized persons. (5 CCR 433)

County placing agency means the county social service department or county probation department. (Education Code 49061)

#### PERSONS GRANTED ACCESS WITHOUT PRIOR WRITTEN CONSENT

The following persons or agencies shall have absolute access to any and all student records in accordance with law:

STUDENTS 5125 / AR-1

- 1. Parents/guardians of students younger than age 18 (Education Code 49069)
  - Access to student records and information shall not be denied to a parent because he/she is not the child's custodial parent. (Family Code 3025)
- An adult student age 18 or older or a student under the age of 18 who attends a postsecondary
  institution, in which case the student alone shall exercise rights related to his/her student
  records and grant consent for the release of records (34 CFR 99.3, 99.5)
- 3. Any person, agency, or organization authorized in compliance with a court order or lawfully issued subpoena (Education Code 49077)

Unless otherwise instructed by the court, the Superintendent or designee shall, prior to disclosing a record pursuant to a court order or subpoena, give the parent/guardian or adult student at least three days' notice of the name of the requesting agency and the specific record requested, if lawfully possible within the requirements of the judicial order. (34 CFR 99.31; 5 CCR 435)

In addition, the following persons or agencies shall have access to those particular records that are relevant to their legitimate educational interest: (34 CFR 99.31; Education Code 49076)

- 1. Parents/guardians of a dependent student age 18 or older
- 2. Students who are age 16 or older or who have completed the 10th grade
- 3. School officials and employees (consistent with criteria defined by the district)
- 4. Members of a school attendance review board (SARB) and any volunteer aide age 18 or older who has been investigated, selected, and trained by the SARB to provide follow-up services to a referred student (cf. 5113.1 - Truancy)
- 5. Officials and employees of other public schools, school systems, or postsecondary institutions where the student intends or is directed to enroll, including local, county, or state correctional facilities where educational programs leading to high school graduation are provided, or where the student is already enrolled, as long as the disclosure is for purposes related to the student's enrollment or transfer
- Federal, state, and local officials, as needed for program audits or compliance with law
- Any district attorney who is participating in or conducting a truancy mediation program or
  participating in the presentation of evidence in a truancy petition or a prosecuting agency for
  consideration against a parent/guardian for failure to comply with compulsory education laws
- Any probation officer or district attorney for the purposes of conducting a criminal investigation
  or an investigation in regards to declaring a person a ward of the court or involving a violation of
  a condition of probation
- Any judge or probation officer for the purpose of conducting a truancy mediation program for a student or for the purpose of presenting evidence in a truancy petition pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code 681.
  - Upon releasing student information to a judge or probation officer in such cases, the Superintendent or designee shall inform, or provide written notification to, the student's parent/guardian within 24 hours. (Education Code 49076)

STUDENTS 5125 / AR-1

10. Any county placing agency for the purpose of fulfilling educational case management responsibilities required by the juvenile court or by law pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code 16010 and to assist with the school transfer or enrollment of a student (cf. 6173.1 -Education for Foster Youth)

Foster family agencies with jurisdiction over currently enrolled or former students may access those students' records of grades and transcripts and any individualized education program (IEP) developed and maintained by the district with respect to such students. (Education Code 49069.3) (cf. 6159 - Individualized Education Program)

When authorized by law to assist law enforcement in investigations of suspected kidnapping, the Superintendent or designee shall provide information about the identity and location of the student as it relates to the transfer of that student's records to another public school district or California private school. The information shall be released only to designated peace officers, federal criminal investigators, and federal law enforcement officers whose names have been submitted in writing by their law enforcement agency in accordance with the procedures specified in Education Code 49076.5. (Education Code 49076.5)

The Superintendent or designee may release information from a student's records to the following: (34 CFR 99.31, 99.36; Education Code 49076)

- 1. Appropriate persons, including parents/guardians of a student, in an emergency, if the health and safety of the student or other persons are at stake
- 2. Accrediting associations
- 3. Under the conditions specified in Education Code 49076 and 34 CFR 99.31, organizations conducting studies on behalf of educational institutions or agencies for the purpose of developing, validating, or administering predictive tests, administering student aid programs, or improving instruction, provided that:
  - a. The study is conducted in a manner that does not permit personal identification of parents/guardians and students by individuals other than representatives of the organization who have legitimate interests in the information.
  - b. The information is destroyed when no longer needed for the purposes for which the study is conducted.
  - c. The district enters into a written agreement with the organization that includes the information in 34 CFR 99.31.
- Officials and employees of private schools or school systems where the student is enrolled or intends to enroll
- 5. Agencies or organizations in connection with the student's application for or receipt of financial aid

However, information permitting the personal identification of a student or his/her parents/guardians for these purposes may be disclosed only as may be necessary to determine the eligibility of the student for financial aid, determine the amount of financial aid, determine

the conditions which will be imposed regarding the financial aid, or enforce the terms or conditions of the financial aid.

 County elections officials for the purpose of identifying students eligible to register to vote and offering such students an opportunity to register (cf. 1400 - Relations Between Other Governmental Agencies and the Schools)

The Superintendent or designee may release information specified in law regarding a student's immunization record to local health departments operating countywide or regional immunization information and reminder systems and the California Department of Public Health. Prior to releasing such information, the Superintendent or designee shall notify the parent/guardian of his/her rights in accordance with law. (Health and Safety Code 120440)

#### PERSONS GRANTED ACCESS WITH PRIOR WRITTEN CONSENT

Persons, agencies, or organizations not afforded access rights by law may be granted access only through written permission of the parent/guardian or adult student, or by judicial order. (Education Code 49075)

Only a parent/guardian having legal custody of the student may consent to the release of records to others. Either parent may grant consent if both parents notify the district, in writing, that such an agreement has been made. (Education Code 49061) (cf. 5021 - Noncustodial Parents)

Any person or agency granted access is prohibited from releasing information to another person or agency without written permission from the parent/guardian or adult student. (Education Code 49076)

#### **ACCESS TO RECORDS BY AUTHORIZED PERSONS**

Student records shall be maintained in a central file at the school attended by the student or, when records are maintained in different locations, a notation shall be placed in the central file indicating where other records may be found. Parents/guardians shall be notified of the location of student records if not centrally located. (Education Code 49069; 5 CCR 433)

The custodian of records shall be responsible for the security of student records and shall assure that access is limited to authorized persons. (5 CCR 433)

The custodian of records shall develop reasonable methods, including physical, technological, and administrative controls, to ensure that school officials and employees obtain access to only those student records in which they have legitimate educational interests. (34 CFR 99.31)

To inspect, review, or obtain copies of student records, authorized persons shall submit a request to the custodian of records. For those individuals for whom the law requires that access be granted based on a legitimate educational interest, the request shall specify such interest involved. Prior to granting the request, the custodian of records shall authenticate the individual's identity.

STUDENTS 5125 / AR-1

When prior written consent is required by law, the parent/guardian shall provide a signed and dated written consent before the district discloses the student record. Such consent may be given through electronic means in those cases where it can be authenticated. The district's consent form shall specify the records that may be disclosed, state the purpose of the disclosure, and identify the party or class of parties to whom the disclosure may be made. Upon request by the parent/guardian, the district shall provide him/her a copy of the records disclosed. (34 CFR 99.30)

Within five business days following the date of request, a parent/guardian or other authorized person shall be granted access to inspect, review, and obtain copies of student records during regular school hours. (Education Code 49069)

Qualified certificated personnel shall be available to interpret records when requested. (Education Code 49069)

The custodian of records or the Superintendent or designee shall prevent the alteration, damage, or loss of records during inspection. (5 CCR 435)

#### **ACCESS LOG**

A log shall be maintained Ffor each student's record, record which lists the school custodian of records shall keep a log identifying all persons, agencies or organizations requesting or receiving information from the records and the legitimate educational interest of the requester. (Education Code 49064). Such listing need not include: (Education Code 49064)

In every instance of inspection by persons who do not have assigned educational responsibility, the custodian of records shall make an entry in the log indicating the record inspected, the name of the person granted access, the reason access was granted, and the time and circumstances of inspection. (5 CCR 435)

The log does not need to include record of access by: (Education Code 49064)

- 1. Parents/guardians or adult students.
- Students who are 16 years of age or older or who have completed the tenth-10<sup>th</sup> grade.
- 3. Parties obtaining district-approved directory information. (cf. 5125.1 Release of Directory Information)
- 4. Parties who provide written parental consent, iln this which case, the consent notice shall be filed with the record pursuant to Education Code 49075.
- 5. School officials or employees who have a legitimate educational interest.

The log shall be accessible only to the parent/guardian, adult student, dependent adult student, student who's age is 16 years or older or who has completed the 10<sup>th</sup> grade, the custodian of records, and certain state/federal officials. (Education Code 49064; 5 CCR 432)

#### **DE-IDENTIFICATION OF RECORDS**

The Superintendent or designee may release information from a student record without prior consent of

the parent/guardian or adult student after the removal of all personally identifiable information, provided that he/she has made a reasonable determination that the student's identity is not personally identifiable, whether through single or multiple releases, and taking into account other reasonably available information. (34 CFR 99.31)

The Superintendent or designee may release de-identified student data from education records for the purpose of educational research in accordance with the conditions specified in 34 CFR 99.31.

#### **DUPLICATION OF STUDENT RECORDS**

To provide copies of any student record, the district shall charge a reasonable fee not to exceed the actual cost of providing the copies. No charge shall be made for providing up to two transcripts or up to two verifications of various records for any former student. No charge shall be made to locate or retrieve any student record. (Education Code 49065)

#### **CHANGES TO STUDENT RECORDS**

No additions except routine updating shall be made to a student's record after high school graduation or permanent departure without prior consent of the parent/guardian or adult student. (5 CCR 437)

Only a parent/guardian having legal custody of the student or an adult student may challenge the content of a record or offer a written response to a record. (Education Code 49061) (cf. 5125.3 - Challenging Student Records)

#### RETENTION AND DESTRUCTION OF STUDENT RECORDS

No additions except routine updating shall be made to a student's record after high school graduation or permanent departure without prior consent of the parent or adult student. All anecdotal information and assessment reports maintained as student records shall be dated and signed by the individual who originated the data. (5 CCR 431)

The following Mmandatory permanent student records shall be kept in perpetuityindefinitely: (5 CCR 432, 437)

- 1. Legal name of student
- 2. Date and place of birth and method of verifying birth date (cf. 5111 Admission)
- 3. Sex of student
- 4. Name and address of parent/guardian of minor student
  - a. Address of minor student if different from the above
  - b. Annual verification of parent/guardian's name and address and student's residence (cf. 5111.1 District Residency) (cf. 5111.12 Residency Based on Parent/Guardian Employment) (cf. 5111.13 Residency for Homeless Children)
- 5. Entrance and departure dates of each school year and for any summer session or other extra session

STUDENTS 5125 / AR-1

- 6. Subjects taken during each year, half-year, summer session, or quarter, and marks or credits given (cf. 5121 Grades/Evaluation of Student Achievement)
- 7. Verification of or exemption from required immunizations (cf. 5141.31 Immunizations)
- 8. Date of high school graduation or equivalent

Unless forwarded to another district, mMandatory interim student records, unless forwarded to another district, may be destroyed three years after determining that their usefulness has ceased or that the student has left the district. shall be maintained subject to destruction during the third school year following a determination that their usefulness has ceased or the student has left the district. These records include: (Education Code 48918, 51747; 5 CCR 432, 437, 16027)

- 1. Expulsion orders and the causes therefore (cf. 5144.1 Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process) (cf. 5144.2 Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process (Students with Disabilities))
- 2. A log identifying persons or agencies that request or receive information from the student record
- 3. Health information, including verification or waiver of the health screening for school entry (cf. 5141.32 Health Screening for School Entry)
- Information on participation in special education programs, including required tests, case studies, authorizations, and evidence of eligibility for admission or discharge (cf. 6159 -Individualized Education Program) (cf. 6164.4 - Identification and Evaluation of Individuals for Special Education)
- 5. Language training records (cf. 6174 Education for English Language Learners)
- 6. Progress slips/notices required by Education Code 49066 and 49067
- 7. Parental restrictions/stipulations regarding access to directory information
- 8. Parent/guardian or adult student rejoinders to challenged records and to disciplinary action
- 9. Parent/guardian authorization or denial of student participation in specific programs
- 10. Results of standardized tests administered within the past three years (cf. 6162.51 Standardized Testing and Reporting Program) (cf. 6162.52 High School Exit Examination)
- 11. Written findings resulting from an evaluation conducted after a specified number of missed assignments to determine whether it is in a student's best interest to remain in independent study (cf. 6158 Independent Study)

Permitted student records may be destroyed when their usefulness ceases. They may be destroyed six months after the student completes or withdraws from the educational program. program. including: (5 CCR 432, 437)

- 1. Objective counselor and/or teacher ratings
- 2. Standardized test results older than three years
- 3. Routine disciplinary data (cf. 5144 Discipline)
- 4. Verified reports of relevant behavioral patterns

STUDENTS 5125 / AR-1

- 5. All disciplinary notices
- 6. Supplementary attendance records

Records shall be destroyed in a way that guarantees assures they will not be viewed by the public available to possible public inspection in the process of destruction. (5 CCR 437)

# **Access to Student Records**

The custodian of records shall be responsible for the security of student records and shall assure that access is limited to authorized persons.

Within five days following the date of request, an authorized person shall be granted access to inspect, review and obtain copies of student records during regular school hours.

Persons, agencies or organizations not afforded access rights may be granted access only through written permission of the adult student or the parent.

Access to student records and information shall not be denied to a parent because he/she is not the child's custodial parent.

Those granted access are prohibited from releasing information to another person or agency without written permission from the parent or adult student (age 18 or older).

Certificated personnel will be available to interpret records where appropriate.

#### TRANSFER OF STUDENT RECORDS

If a student transfers into this district from any other school district or a private school, the Superintendent or designee shall inform the parent/guardian of his/her rights regarding student records, including the right to review, challenge, and receive a copy of student records. (Education Code 49068; 5 CCR 438)

When a student transfers into this district from another district, the Superintendent or designee shall request that the student's previous district provide any records, either maintained by that district in the ordinary course of business or received from a law enforcement agency, regarding acts committed by the transferring student that resulted in his/her suspension or expulsion. (Education Code 48201) (cf. 4158/4258/4358 - Employee Security) (cf. 5119 - Students Expelled From Other Districts)

When a student transfers from this district to another school district or to a private school, the Superintendent or designee shall forward a copy of the student's mandatory permanent record as requested by the other district or private school. The original record or a copy shall be retained permanently by this district. If the transfer is to another California public school, the student's entire mandatory interim record shall also be forwarded. If the transfer is out of state or to a private school, the mandatory interim record may be forwarded. Permitted student records may be forwarded to any other district or private school. (Education Code 48918; 5 CCR 438)

Upon receiving a request from a county placing agency to transfer a student in foster care out of a district school, the Superintendent or designee shall transfer the student's records to the next educational placement within two business days. (Education Code 49069.5) (cf. 6173.1 - Education for

#### Foster Youth)

All student records shall be updated before they are transferred. (5 CCR 438)

Student records shall not be withheld from the requesting district because of any charges or fees owed by the student or parent/guardian. (5 CCR 438)

If the district is withholding grades, diploma, or transcripts from the student because of his/her damage or loss of school property, this information shall be sent to the requesting district along with the student's records. (cf. 5125.2 - Withholding Grades, Diploma or Transcripts)

#### **Mandatory Access**

The following persons or agencies shall have access to student records:

- 1. Natural parents, adoptive parents, or legal guardians of students younger than age 18. Upon request, qualified certificated staff will be available to interpret the records.
- Adult students (age 18 or older) or students under the age of 18 who attend a post-secondary
  institution, in which case the student shall alone exercise rights related to his/her student
  records and grant consent for the release of records. (Ed. Code 49061, 34 CFR 99.5)
- 3. Those so authorized in compliance with a court order or lawfully issued subpoena-
- 4. Prior to disclosing a record pursuant to a court order, the superintendent or designee shall, unless otherwise instructed by the order, give the parent/guardian or adult student at least three days' notice of the name of the requesting agency and the specific record requested if lawfully possible within the requirements of the judicial order. ( 5 CCR 435)

The following persons or agencies shall have access to those particular records which are relevant to the legitimate educational interests of the requestor:

- 1. Natural parents, adoptive parents or legal guardians of a dependent student age 18 or older.
- 2. Students 16 or older or who have completed the 10th grade.
- 3. School officials and employees.
- 4. School attendance and review board members and involved school officials and employees.
- 5. Officials or employees of other public schools or school systems where educational programs leading to high school graduation are provided.
- 6. Federal, state and local officials, as needed for program audits or compliance with law.
- 7. Any district attorney who is participating in or conducting a truancy mediation program or participating in the presentation of evidence in a truancy petition.
- 8. A prosecuting agency for consideration against a parent/guardian for failure to comply with compulsory education laws.
- Any probation officer or district attorney for the purposes of conducting a criminal investigation or an investigation in regards to declaring a person a ward of the court or involving a violation of

#### a condition of probation.

Upon written request, peace officers designated by their law enforcement agency shall receive information about the transfer of a student's records to another district or private school within the state, or to a district within another state, when authorized by law to assist in suspected kidnapping investigations.

#### **Permitted Access**

Parental consent is not required when information is shared with other persons within educational institutions, agencies or organizations obtaining access, so long as those persons have a legitimate interest in the information.

The district may release information from student records to the following:

- 1. Appropriate persons in an emergency if health and safety are at stake.
- 2. Agencies or organizations in connection with student's application for financial aid.
- 3. Accrediting associations.
- 4. Under the conditions specified in Education Code 49076, Organizations conducting studies on behalf of educational institutions or agencies, for the purpose of developing, validating or administering predictive tests, administering student aid programs or improving instruction.
- 5. Officials and employees of private schools or school systems where the student is enrolled or intends to enroll, subject to the parental rights in Education Code 49068.
- County elections officials may have access to information for the purpose of identifying students
  eligible to register to vote and offering such students an opportunity to register.

#### **NOTIFICATION OF PARENTS / GUARDIANS**

Upon any student's initial enrollment, and at the beginning of each year thereafter, the Superintendent or designeedistrict shall notify parents/guardians and eligible students, in writing, of their rights related to student records. Insofar as practicable, the district shall provide these notices shall be written in the student's home language and shall effectively notify parents/guardians or eligible students who are disabled. (Education Code 49063) (cf. 5145.6 - Parental Notifications)

The notice shall include information about: (34 CFR 99.7, 99.34; Education Code 49063)

- 1. The types of student records kept by the district and the information contained therein-
- 2. The titles of the officials responsible for maintaining each type of the records.
- The location of the log identifying those who request information from the records-
- 4. District criteria for defining "school officials and employees" and for determining "legitimate educational interest."
- 5. District policies for reviewing and expunging student records-

- 6. The right to inspect and review student records and the procedures for doing so
- 67. The right to challenge and District the procedures for challenging the content of a student records that the parent/guardian or student believes to be inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights- (cf. 5125.3 Challenging Student Records)
- 78. The cost, if any, charged for reproducing duplicating copies of records.
- 89. The Categories of information defined as directory information pursuant to Education Code 49073.
- 910. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's records except when disclosure without consent is authorized by law Any other rights and requirements set forth in Education Code 49060-49078, and the right of the parents to file a complaint with the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare concerning an alleged failure by the district to comply with the provisions of Section 438 of the Federal Education Provisions Act (20 U.S.C.A. 1232g).
- 1011. The. The availability of the curriculum prospectus developed pursuant to Education Code 49091.14 containing the titles, descriptions, and instructional aims of every course offered by the school (cf. 5020 Parent Rights and Responsibilities) qualified certificated personnel to interpret records when requested.
- 12. Any other rights and requirements set forth in Education Code 49060-49078, and the right of the parents to file a complaint with the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare concerning an alleged failure by the district to comply with the provisions of Section 438 of the Federal Education Provisions Act (20 U.S.C.A. 1232g).
- 13. A statement that the district forwards education records to other agencies or institutions that request the records and in which the student seeks or intends to enroll or is already enrolled as long as the disclosure is for purposes related to the student's enrollment (3/06 3/08) 3/09

#### Reproduction of Student Records

To provide copies of any student record, the district shall charge a reasonable fee not to exceed the actual cost of reproducing, handling and mailing (if necessary). No charge shall be made for furnishing up to two transcripts or up to two verifications of various records for any former student. No charge shall be made to locate or retrieve any student record.

The Superintendent or designee shall set the fee and update the amount yearly if actual costs change.

#### **Transfer of Student Records**

If-a student transfers into this district from any other school-district or private school, this district shall forward a copy of the student's-mandatory permanent records as requested by the other district or private school. The original record or a copy shall be retained permanently by this district.

Mandatory interim records also shall be sent upon request to other California public school districts. Mandatory interim records may also be sent to out of state or private schools requesting them.

Permitted records may be sent to any other public school district or private school.

All student records shall be updated before they are transferred.

If the student transfers into the district from any other school district or a private school, this district shall inform the parent of his/her right to receive a copy of the permanent record received from the former school. The parent shall also be informed of his/her right to have a hearing in which to challenge the contents of that record.

If the student transfers out of state, the custodian of student records shall notify the parents at their last known address of their right to review, challenge, and receive a copy of the student record, if desired.

Student records shall not be withheld from the requesting district because of any charges or fees owed by the student or parent.

If the district is withholding grades, diploma or transcripts from the student because of his/her damage to or loss of school property, this information shall be sent to the requesting district along with the student's records.

# **ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUGS / STUDENT ASSISTANCE SERVICES**

The Board of Trustees believes that the first substance abuse offense (i.e., under the influence, possession or sales) indicates that a student may have a serious involvement with alcohol or drugs and could, therefore, be a danger to him/herself or others. If an investigation reveals a problem associated with chemical abuse, a clear concern about the potential danger must be communicated by the school to the appropriate parties.

#### **STUDENT ASSISTANCE SERVICES/GUIDELINES**

A Student Assistance Services (S.A.S.) program will be established that will provide a structured approach in all schools within the district to offer assistance to students troubled by physical, emotional, social, legal, sexual, medical, familial, or chemical use problems. It will also provide a structured liaison between the school, the parent and outside agencies. These services will be provided by a S.A.S. Team responsible to the site principal. The team may consist of, but not be limited to, an administrator, counselor, nurse, teacher, other staff, S.A.S. coordinator, and at times, the team may consist of only a case manager designated by the principal. The duties of the S.A.S. team may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Provide preliminary assessment of student problems.
- Develop an action plan which may consist of, but not be limited to: individual contracting, formal
  intervention, aftercare program, educational program adjustments, referral to outside agencies for
  additional assessment.
- 3. Referral for secondary assessment, if appropriate. (Costs for secondary assessment, treatment, and/or other professional services outside the school are the responsibility of the parents or guardians.)
- 4. Develop a re-entry program.
- 5. In the event of an intra district transfer, initiate a mandatory meeting with the S.A.S. team of the receiving school.
- 6. Maintain follow-up and periodic evaluation of action plan.
- 7. Maintain confidentiality regarding all records and discussions within the S.A.S. (These records will be kept by a designated S.A.S. case manager and will not become a part of the student's cumulative file.)

# **DISCIPLINE PROCEDURES FOR SUBSTANCE ABUSE OFFENSES**

Students engaged in the following activities will be subject to the Disciplinary Procedure for Substance Abuse Offenses:

- 1. Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of any controlled substance as defined in the Health and Safety Code, Section 11007, alcoholic beverage, or intoxicant of any kind.
- 2. Unlawfully offered or arranged or negotiated to sell any controlled substance as defined in #1 above, alcoholic beverage or intoxicant of any kind, and then sold, delivered, or otherwise furnished to any

person another liquid, substance, or material and represented same as a controlled substance, alcoholic beverage, or intoxicant (look-a-likes).

3. Unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any drug paraphernalia, as defined in Section 11364 of the Health and Safety Code.

All students identified as having a substance abuse problem will be referred to the S.A.S. Team who will conduct a preliminary assessment and recommend an action plan to the school principal. The S.A.S. Team will consider all due process procedures provided in Board policy when dealing with students referred for a suspendable offense related to substance abuse. The following discipline procedure is intended for use with students who do not voluntarily take part in the S.A.S. program provided by the San Dieguito Union High School District:

#### 1. First Offense

- a. The appropriate law enforcement agency will be notified.
- b. The student will be subject to a consecutive 5-day suspension except that a portion of the suspension may be waived if the student participates in a S.A.S. designed program.
- c. Students involved in a suspension under this process will be ineligible for extra-curricular activities, i.e., athletic competition, team competition, or school performances, dances, etc. The term of the suspension from extra-curricular activities will be for thirty school days. The S.A.S. Team may make a recommendation to the principal that the thirty day suspension from activities is inappropriate. If the principal alters the suspension from extra-curricular activities, a written report must be filed with the Superintendent reciting the facts of the incident along with a recommended course of action. The thirty school days will begin on the first day of suspension.

Intra-district transfer or expulsion will be considered on the first offense if the level of severity is considered serious enough to warrant removal from the school setting. Students considered for suspension or expulsion are entitled to all due process rights outlined in the Board policy.

- 2. Second Offense (within a period of 24 months)
  - a. The student will be referred by the S.A.S. team to the principal for expulsion.
  - b. When expulsion is not recommended, there may be a mandatory intra-district transfer. The transfer will require meetings between both S.A.S. teams from the sending school and the receiving school with strict guidelines for continuing aftercare at the school of residence. Students who are transferred to another intra-district site may be ineligible to participate in extra-curricular programs. No student may return to the originating campus without approval of the principal of the school of residence after review by the S.A.S. Team.
  - c. Where the principal determines, after consultation with the S.A.S. Team, that expulsion or mandatory transfer is inappropriate due to the particular circumstances, a written report shall be prepared in cooperation with the superintendent that recites the facts of the incident along with a recommended course of action. The report shall be filed with the Board of Trustees for consideration.

#### SUSPENSION/DIVERSION FOR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE OFFENSES

Students subject to a consecutive 5-day suspension will have the opportunity to waive a portion for voluntarily choosing to participate in a 3-day S.A.S. designed program as follows:

- 1. Assessment of problem which would include drug testing if appropriate.
- 2. Supervised suspension from school for 3 days, which will consist of a S.A.S. designed program. The program will include a timeline for the completion of all contracted activities. These activities may extend beyond the 3-day suspension and the school day.
- 3. Failure to complete the contract will result in a consecutive 5-day suspension inclusive of any days spent.

Students who choose not to participate in the 3-day diversion program will be subject to a consecutive 5-day suspension that will include the following components:

- 1. Referral to the appropriate law enforcement agency.
- 2. Participation in a law enforcement diversion program as appropriate.

All students will be required to participate in a S.A.S. designed aftercare program upon returning to school from a suspension due to a chemical abuse offense.

# **CONFLICT OF INTEREST**

# **Incompatible Activities**

Governing Board members shall not engage in any employment or activity which is inconsistent with, incompatible with, in conflict with or inimical to the Board member's duties as an officer of the District. (Government Code 1126)

### **Conflict of Interest Code**

The District's conflict of interest code shall be comprised of the terms of California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18730 and any amendments to it adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, together with a District attachment specifying designated positions and the specific types of disclosure statements required for each position.

Upon direction by the code reviewing body, the Board shall review the District's conflict of interest code in even-numbered years. If no change in the code is required, the District shall submit by October 1 a written statement to that effect to the code reviewing body. If a change in the code is necessitated by changed circumstances, the District shall submit an amended code to the code reviewing body. (Government Code 87306.5)

When a change in the District's conflict of interest code is necessitated by changed circumstances such as the creation of new designated positions, amendments or revisions shall be submitted to the code reviewing body within 90 days. (Government Code 87306)

When reviewing and preparing conflict of interest codes the District shall provide officers, employees, consultants and members of the community adequate notice and a fair opportunity to present their views. (Government Code 87311)

If a Board member or designated employee determines that he/she has a financial interest in a decision, as described in Government Code 87103, this determination shall be disclosed. The member shall be disqualified from voting unless his/her participation is legally required. (2 CCR 18700)

Statements of economic interests submitted to the District by designated employees in accordance with the conflict of interest code shall be available for public inspection and reproduction. (Government Code 81008)

#### **Financial Interest**

Board members and designated employees shall not be financially interested in any contract made by the Board or in any contract they make in their capacity as Board members or designated employees. (Government Code 1090)

A Board member shall not be considered to be financially interested in a contract if his/her interest includes, but is not limited to, any of the following:

(Government Code 1091.5)

- 1. That of an officer who is being reimbursed for his/her actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of an official duty.
- 2. That of a recipient of public services generally provided by the public body or board of which he/she is a member, on the same terms and conditions as if he or she were not a member of the Board.

- 3. That of a landlord or tenant of the contracting party if such contracting party is the federal government or any federal department or agency, this state or an adjoining state, any department or agency of this state or an adjoining state, any county or city of this state or an adjoining state, or any public corporation or special, judicial or other public district of this state or an adjoining state unless the subject matter of such contract is the property in which such officer or employee has such interest as landlord or tenant in which even his/her interest shall be deemed a remote interest within the meaning of, and subject to, the provisions of Government Code 1091.
- 4. That of a spouse of an officer or employee of the District if his/her spouse's employment or office holding has existed for at least one year prior to his/her election or appointment.
- 5. That of a non-salaried member of a nonprofit corporation, provided that such interest is disclosed to the Board at the time of the first consideration of the contract, and provided further that such interest is noted in its official records.
- 6. That of a non-compensated officer of a nonprofit, tax-exempt corporation which, as one of its primary purposes, supports the functions of the nonprofit board or to which the school board has legal obligation to give particular consideration, and provided further that such interest is noted in its official records.
- 7. That of a person receiving salary, per diem, or reimbursement for expenses from a governmental entity, unless the contract directly involves the department of the government entity that employs the officer or employee, provided that such interest is disclosed to the Board at the time of consideration of the contract, and provided further that such interest is noted in its official records.
- 8. That of an attorney of the contracting party or that of an owner, officer, employee or agent of a firm which renders, or has rendered, service to the contracting party in the capacity of stockbroker, insurance agent, insurance broker, real estate agent, or real estate broker, if these individuals have not received and will not receive remuneration, consideration, or a commission as a result of the contract and if these individuals have an ownership interest of less than 10 percent in the law practice or firm, stock brokerage firm, insurance firm or real estate firm.

In addition, a Board member or employee shall not be deemed to be interested in a contract made pursuant to competitive bidding under a procedure established by law if his/her sole interest is that of an officer, director, or employee of a bank or savings and loan association with which a party to the contract has the relationship of borrower or depositor, debtor or creditor. (Government Code 1091.5)

A Board member shall not be deemed to be financially interested in a contract if he/she has only a remote interest in the contract and if the remote interest is disclosed during a Board meeting and noted in the official Board minutes. The affected Board member shall not vote or debate on the matter or attempt to influence any other Board member to enter into the contract. Remote interests are specified in Government Code 1091(b); they include, but are not limited to, the interest of a parent in the earnings of his/her minor child. (Government Code 1091)

A Board member may be able to enter into a contract if the rule of necessity or legally required participation applies as defined in Government Code 87101. Legal counsel should be consulted, however, in such situations.

Even if there is no prohibited or remote interest, a Board member shall abstain from voting on personnel matters that uniquely affect a relative of the Board member. A Board member may vote, however, on collective bargaining agreements and personnel matters that affect a class of employees to which the relative belongs. "Relative" means an adult who is related to the person by blood or affinity within the third degree, as determined by the common law, or an individual in an adoptive relationship within the third degree. (Education Code 35107)

A relationship within the third degree includes the individual's parents, grandparents and greatgrandparents, children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, brothers, sisters, aunts and uncles, nieces and nephews, and the similar family of the individual's spouse unless the individual is widowed or divorced.

#### **Gifts**

Board members and designated employees may accept gifts only under the conditions and limitations specified in Government Code 89503 and 2 CCR 18730.

The limitations on gifts do not apply to wedding gifts and gifts exchanged between individuals on birthdays, holidays and other similar occasions, provided that the gifts exchanged are not substantially disproportionate in value. (Government Code 89503)

Gifts of travel and related lodging and subsistence shall be subject to the prevailing gift limitation except as described in Government Code 89506.

A gift of travel does not include travel provided by the district for Board members and designated employees. (Government Code 89506)

#### Honoraria

Board members and designated employees shall not accept any honorarium, which is defined as any payment made in consideration for any speech given, article published, or attendance at any public or private gathering, in accordance with law. (Government Codes 89501, 89502)

The term honorarium does not include:

(Government Code 89501)

- 1. Earned income for personal services customarily provided in connection with a bona fide business, trade or profession unless the sole or predominant activity of the business, trade or profession is making speeches.
- 2. Any honorarium which is not used and, within 30 days after receipt, is either returned to the donor or delivered to the district for donation into the general fund without being claimed as a deduction from income for tax purposes.

Designated persons in this category must report investments or business positions in or income from sources which:

- a. Are contractors or subcontractors engaged in work or services of the type used by the department which the designated person manages or directs, or
- b. Manufacture or sell supplies, books, machinery or equipment of the type used by the department which the designated person manages or directs. For the purposes of this category, a principal's department is his/her entire school.
- 3. Consultants are designated employees who must disclose financial interests as determined on a case-by-case basis by the Superintendent or designee. The Superintendent or designee's written determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties and a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements based upon that description. All such determinations are public records and shall be retained for public inspection along with this conflict of interest code.

A consultant is an individual who, pursuant to a contract with the District, makes a governmental decision whether to:

- a. Approve a rate, rule or regulation.
- b. Adopt or enforce a law.
- c. Issue, deny, suspend or revoke a permit, license, application, certificate, approval, order or similar authorization or entitlement.

- e. Grant District approval to a contract or contract specifications which require District approval and in which the District is a party.
- f. Grant District approval to a plan, design, report, study or similar item.
- g. Adopt or grant District approval of District policies, standards or guidelines.

A consultant is also an individual who, pursuant to a contract with the District, serves in a staff capacity with the District and in that capacity participates in making a governmental decision as defined in 2 CCR 18702.2, or performs the same or substantially all the same duties for the District that would otherwise be performed by an individual holding a position specified in the District's Conflict of Interest Code. (2 CCR 18701)
