

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The attached Proposition AA – Agreements report summarizes two agreements.

One agreement pertains to Staples Contract & Commercial Inc. (Staples), for furniture for the modernization of the Diegueno Middle School Media Center in the amount of \$97,021.95.

The furniture will be procured from Staples pursuant to District Board Policies 3310 and 3311, Purchasing Procedures and Bids, respectively, and to ensure these policies are being followed, the Board adopted a Resolution on November 11, 2011 authorizing contracting pursuant to cooperative bid from the National Joint Powers Alliance (NJPA). The NJPA establishes and provides nationally leveraged and competitively solicited purchasing contracts.

One agreement pertains to Culver-Newlin, Inc., for furniture at La Costa Canyon High School for the modernization of the Media Center and the 800 Buildings in an amount of \$400,578.78.

The furniture will be procured from Culver-Newlin, Inc. pursuant to District Board Policies 3310 and 3311. Culver-Newlin, Inc. is under contract with North County Educational Purchasing Consortium (NCEPC), contract number 0114. The District is a member of the NCEPC which was formed on July 7, 1985. NCEPC was formed by a small group of local school district purchasing officials to combine efforts to affect greater buying power and savings, meet legal requirements and reduce duplicative administrative efforts.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board approve and/or ratify the professional services contracts and authorize Christina M. Bennett, Eric R. Dill, or Rick Schmitt to execute the agreements, as noted in the attached supplement.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The attached Professional Services Report/Proposition AA summarizes three amendments to existing contracts.

At the April 3, 2014 board meeting the Board adopted the resolution approving and authorizing execution of site lease, sublease agreement, and construction services agreement for the Lease/Leaseback Agreement with Balfour Beatty Construction, LLC (Balfour Beatty) for the construction of Middle School #5. On April 24, 2014, bids were conducted by Balfour Beatty, under the supervision of District staff. A total of 30 trade packages were issued for bid to a total of 210 contractors. A total of 80 contractors responded, some with multiple bids across trade packages. The preliminary Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) was established at the April 3 meeting at \$34,295,500.00. After review of the bids, the preliminary GMP is amended, decreasing the amount by \$1,769,537.00 for a final GMP in the amount of \$32,525,963.00.

At the March 20, 2014 board meeting the Board adopted the resolution approving and authorizing execution of site lease, sublease agreement, and construction services agreement for the Lease/Leaseback Agreement with Erickson Hall Construction, Inc. (Erickson Hall), at Torrey Pines High School for the Phase 1 project that includes the replacement of the stadium lights, interim housing for weight room and associated infrastructure, fire road improvement, and construction of the chemistry and permanent weight room buildings. On April 25, 2014, bids were conducted by Erickson Hall, under the supervision of District staff. A total of 16 divisions of work were issued for bid to a total of 275 contractors. A total of 128 contractors responded. The preliminary Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) was established at the March

20 meeting at \$7,984,142. After review of the bids, the preliminary GMP is amended as a result decreasing the amount by \$275.00 for a final GMP in an amount of \$7,983,867.00.

The third amendment with Lionakis, an architectural firm, under contract with the District to perform Architectural services at various school sites in the District. The District seeks to amend contract A2013-146 for architectural/engineering services for Middle School #5 to include enhanced construction administration services to provide for weekly, rather than biweekly, site visits throughout construction of Middle School #5, during the period of May 16, 2014 through March 31, 2016.

It is recommended that the Board approve and/or ratify amendments to the professional services contracts, and authorize Christina M. Bennett, Eric R. Dill, or Rick Schmitt to execute the agreements, as noted in the attached supplement.



SUBJECT: ADOPTION OF THE 2013-14 SPRING

REVISION DISTRICT BUDGET

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

During the current fiscal year, the administration has taken a revised budget to the Board three times since the adoption in June. The Fall Revision, First Interim and Second Interim reports are required by state law; the Spring Revision is presented to update the Board on changes that have occurred since Second Interim and to project year-end General Fund revenue, expense, and ending balances. Although the Spring Revision includes the most recent data available, actual 2013-14 income and expenditure information will not be confirmed until the books are closed on the current fiscal year in September.

With respect to income, Property Tax estimates have remained fairly stable throughout the year; however, the administration has chosen to wait until most of the current year receipts were received before showing an increase. The receipts through April are tracking with the current estimates. The budget shows an increase in the Revenue Limit Sources to reflect the current Property Tax estimates.

State revenue is up due to prior year Restricted Lottery received. Local revenue has increased as donations and other local revenue sources are budgeted as they are received. Expenditures have decreased overall primarily due to reducing the restricted Common Core budget to plan for 14/15 expenses from carryover funds. Special Education expenses have been decreased in the area of Mental Health, including Residential Treatment Centers. Throughout the year, students have transitioned from residential centers to local programs. We can now see the savings of those transitions during this year and have reduced budgets to reflect the decreased expenses. This results in a reduced contribution from the unrestricted general fund.

While we expect to realize additional savings at year-end from unspent balances in both unrestricted and restricted funds, it is difficult to estimate at this time as we have been actively lowering unrestricted budgets throughout the year when anticipated expenditures have fallen below budgeted amounts.

The projected ending balance has improved to a slight surplus over all, but still a small deficit in the unrestricted general fund. This is due primarily to the increase in property tax and decrease in common core and special education expenses. Detailed information for income and expenditures can be found on the following pages.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board adopt the 2013-14 Spring Revision District Budget, as shown in the attached supplement.

Positions and Incumbents for Fiscal

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Changes in the support needs of two programs warrant the reduction in hours of two positions.

The Nutrition Services Supervisor at Earl Warren Middle School has been providing supervisory coverage at two sites, Earl Warren and Diegueño Middle School. The Nutrition Services Department has determined that each cafeteria now needs its own supervisor, which requires reduced hours of the current single position.

A review of the need for campus supervising support at Sunset High School concluded that 3.9 hours is sufficient to meet the operations at that site, rather than the current six hours. CSEA is aware of this change.

The purpose of this recommended Board action is to initiate the process of reducing the identified positions and ensuring implementation of all layoff rights for the affected incumbents.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board adopt the resolution initiating layoff and/or reduction in hours and/or months of classified employees/positions for fiscal year 2014-15, as shown in the attached supplement.

SUBJECT: LOCAL CONTROL ACCOUNTABILITY PLAN (LCAP)

UPDATE

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Complementing the changes to state funding made by the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) is a newly required Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP). The LCAP is LCFF's vehicle for transparency and engagement. It is the way that school districts are expected to share performance data, needs, actions, and anticipated outcomes that guide the use of available LCFF funding. Before the start of the 2014-15 school year, all districts will need to have in place a Local Control and Accountability Plan prior to the adoption of their budget.

According to Education Code section 52060, the LCAP must describe for each district and each school within the district the annual goals for all students including calling out details for low-income, English learners and foster youth that address state and local priorities. The LCAP must also describe the specific actions that the district will take to achieve the goals it has identified with budget details that show the level and type of state expenditures made to support these actions.

The state priorities are expressed as metrics for which districts are expected to develop performance measures to demonstrate how LCFF and the LCAP support student outcomes.

Priority 1: Student Achievement: Pupil achievement as measured by multiple indicators including, but not limited to, assessment data, college readiness, and language proficiency.

- Priority 2: Student Engagement: Pupil engagement as measured by multiple indicators including, but not limited to, rates associated with attendance, chronic absenteeism, dropout (middle and high school), and high school graduation.
- Priority 3: Other Student Outcomes: Pupil outcomes, if available, in the subject areas comprising a broad course of study.
- Priority 4: School Climate: School climate as measured by multiple indicators including, but not limited to, pupil suspension and expulsion rates as well as other local measures assessing safety and school connectedness.
- Priority 5: Parental Involvement: Parental involvement, including efforts the school district makes to seek parent input in making decisions for the school district and each individual school site, and including how the school district will promote parental participation in programs for economically disadvantaged pupils, English learners, foster youth, and individuals with exceptional needs.
- Priority 6: Basic Services: Demonstrating compliance with Williams Act requirements. This includes reporting appropriate teacher assignment, sufficient instructional materials, and facilities in good repair.
- Priority 7: Implementation of Common Core Standards: Implementation of the academic content and performance standards adopted by the State Board of Education (SBE), including how the programs and services will enable English learners to access the Common Core academic content standards and the English Language Development standards.
- Priority 8: Course Access: The extent to which pupils have access to, and are enrolled in, a broad course of study that includes core subject areas (i.e., English, mathematics, social science, science, visual and performing arts, health, physical education, career and technical education, etc.), including the programs and services developed and provided to economically disadvantaged pupils, English learners, foster youth, and individuals with exceptional needs.

Attached is an update of current progress to date and next steps.

Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) and Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)

ITEM 20

What is the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)?

Beginning July 1, 2013, the State of California changed the funding formula for public education and requires school districts to develop a Local control Accountability Plan (LCAP). The LCAP is a plan that aligns the District's educational goals with financial resources. The LCAP is a critical part of the new Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). Under the LCFF all Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) are required to prepare an LCAP, which describes how they intend to meet annual goals for all pupils, with specific activities to address state and local priorities identified pursuant to Education Code Section 52060(d).

California school districts must engage parents, educators, employees, and the community to establish these plans. The plans will describe the school district's overall vision for students, annual goals and specific actions that will be taken to achieve the vision and goals. The LCAPs must focus on eight areas identified as state priorities. The plans will also demonstrate how the district's budget will help achieve the goals, and assess each year how well the strategies in the plan were able to improve outcomes.

What are the eight state priority areas that must be addressed in the plans?

There are eight areas for which school districts, with parent and community input, must establish goals and actions. This must be done both district-wide and for each school. The areas are:


- 1. Providing all students access to fully credentialed teachers, instructional materials that align with state standards, and safe facilities.
- 2. Implementation of California's academic standards, including the Common Core State Standards in English language arts and math, Next Generation Science Standards, English language development, history social science, visual and performing arts, health education, and physical education standards.
- 3. Parent involvement and participation, so the local community is engaged in the decision-making process and the educational programs of students.
- 4. Improving student achievement and outcomes along multiple measures, including test scores, English proficiency and college and career preparedness.
- 5. Supporting student engagement, including whether students attend school or are chronically absent.
- 6. Highlighting school climate and connectedness through a variety of factors, such as suspension and expulsion rates and other locally identified means.
- 7. Ensuring all students have access to classes that prepare them for college and careers, regardless of what school they attend or where they live.
- 8. Measuring other important student outcomes related to required areas of study, including physical education and the arts. In addition to these eight areas, a district may also identify and incorporate in its plan goals related to its own local priorities.

The District will engage community stakeholder's through Common Core Parent Nights (19 total nights) online surveys and our parent advisory groups throughout the month of March and April to gather their feedback regarding local and state priorities. The draft LCAP will be reviewed by the Parent Curriculum Advisory Committee and the District English Learner Advisory Committee, with the final plan to be approved by the Board of Trustees in June 2014. The initial plan will cover three years and will be updated annually by the District by July 1.






