High School Graduation Requirements

AR 6146.1 **Instruction**

Notifications

Requirements for graduation, specified alternative means for completing the prescribed course of study, and information about the availability of exemptions from local graduation requirements and/or credit recovery options available pursuant to Education Code 51225 shall be made available to students, parents/guardians, and the public.

Within 30 days of the transfer into a school by a foster youth, homeless student, former juvenile court school student, child of a military family, migrant student, or a newly arrived immigrant student, the Superintendent or designee shall notify any eligible student of the availability of the exemption from local graduation requirements under Education Code 51225.1 and whether the student qualifies for it.

In the annual notification sent to parents/guardians pursuant to Education Code 48980, the Superintendent or designee shall include the following:

- 1. Information about district high school graduation requirements and how each requirement satisfies or does not satisfy the subject matter requirements for admission to the California State University and the University of California
- 2. A complete list of career technical education courses offered by the district that satisfy the subject matter requirements for admission to the California State University and the University of California, and which of the specific college admission requirements these courses satisfy

Early Graduation Procedures

The purpose of the four-year high school program is to provide students with a combination of academic, vocational and social experiences that will prepare them for entry into the workforce, further training, and/or continued opportunities for postsecondary education. The district's course of study provides students with opportunities to attain the skills, knowledge, and abilities they need to be successful academically, professionally, and personally.

Some students may qualify for early graduation after completing the credit requirements. Each applicant must complete minimum State or Board graduation requirements. Students requesting early graduation have the responsibility for gathering the necessary endorsements and evidence. (see attachment Early Graduation Request Form).
