### Happy New Year!

The San Dieguito Union High School District welcomed students to the second semester/ third quarter at the end of January. We appreciate our community's support, patience and partnership as we've navigated these unprecedented and ever-changing times. Together we are stronger! ### Testing, 1, 2, 3!

Each spring, students take a variety of local and state tests to evaluate their academic progress. Students in grades 7, 8, and 11 will take the Smarter Balanced Assessments for English, Math and the CA Science Test. Students in grade 12 will also take the CA Science Test this year. For 11th grade students, their scores are used to inform students' readiness for college English and mathematics, helping inform placement into college courses. Most tests can be taken in the virtual school environment however the CA Alternate Assessments (CAA) are given in person, in a one on one setting. Only a small percentage of students take the CAA's, decided on by the IEP team. Stay tuned for more information from your student's case manager.

## **California Healthy Kids Survey**

This spring, students in grades 7, 9 and 11 will participate in the California Healthy Kids Survey. The CHKS is an anonymous, confidential survey of school climate and safety, student wellness, and youth resiliency. It enables schools and communities to collect and analyze data regarding local youth health risks and behaviors, school connectedness, school climate, protective factors, and school violence. The CHKS is part of a comprehensive data-driven decision-making process on improving school climate and student learning environment for overall school improvements. Parents also participate by taking the CA School Parent Survey at the same time. More information will come from your child's school in March 2021.

### **Special Education Parent Handbook**

Our team has developed a handbook for parents to serve as a guide to and through the special education referral process. Special Education services are a group of specialized services for students who are identified through an educational assessment as having an educational disability. Each of the priorities is aligned to the SDUHSD Local Control and <u>Accountability Plan (LCAP)</u>, and contains specific action tasks to ensure each goal is implemented in a specific and consistent manner. The team also provided feedback for

### Independent Citizens Oversight Committee Seeking Parent Member

The San Dieguito Union High School District is seeking applicants for appointment to its Independent Citizens Oversight Committee (ICOC). We would like your help in finding people who would be interested in serving on this important committee.

Members of the ICOC will provide oversight of the District's use of Proposition AA bond proceeds and report to the Board and public on their findings. Specifically, the ICOC will ensure that all funds are used in support of the projects included in the bond measure and not for unspecified projects, general operating expenses, or teacher salaries. The ICOC will also inspect facilities and grounds, review cost-saving measures, and review the annual independent audits that are required of general obligation bond funds.

The committee must have no fewer than seven members and is currently recruiting for a parent member. Any parents interested should visit the District website and complete the application on the Facilities page, under the "Facilities Planning and Construction" tab. Applications will be reviewed at the March meeting.
