SDUHSD's Strategic Plan

The purpose of the [SDUHSD Strategic Plan](#) is to develop the structure of programs for students with disabilities in order that they may access standards-aligned content, high quality learning environments, individualized support and resources in the least restrictive environment with priority placed on meaningful student involvement. The Strategic Plan is organized around six priorities that compose the backbone of a highly effective special education program. Each priority has a central goal that is aligned to the SDUHSD Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP), and contains specific action tasks to ensure each goal is implemented in a specific and consistent manner. The District's Strategic Plan Parent Forum meets four times a year to review progress on the District's goals and to advise on new topics. Each school has one parent representative and one administrator in attendance. The Strategic Plan and Summary information are located on the District's Special Education website, under Administrative Services.

Extended School Year: Summer 2021

Our Extended School Year (ESY) served nearly 120 students over the course of a four week session. Students who participate in ESY are eligible/invited to do so via their IEP team following an assessment of regression and recoupment data related to their IEP goals. ESY staff worked very hard to provide instruction intended to maintain levels of performance associated with students' individualized IEP goals; focus areas on English Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Skills, Transition Skills, etc. As a (ESY continued) bonus, it is always a great way for staff to welcome and get to know



our new students joining SDUHSD for the first time from our feeder districts.

We are grateful to staff, parents and students who remained flexible throughout ESY as we adjusted to our new state of the art location at Requeza and made changes along the way to maximize and improve upon our time with students. Thank you to our ESY teachers who worked incredibly hard to deliver meaningful instruction with compassion and care. Their efforts made this ESY a successful and enjoyable four weeks. Thank you to our related services staff (Speech, Transportation, Assistive Technology, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Behavior Intervention and Counseling), to our two district nurses who worked tirelessly and were essential to keeping students, to our classified support staff who worked so hard to assist teachers and students, with positive, cheerful “can do” attitudes!

Fostering Resiliency in Your Child

SDUHSD is committed to supporting students' personal health, safety, and well-being while they are learning. Reaching and teaching the whole child to ensure that all students are included, engaged, challenged, and supported is of the utmost importance. Resiliency is the capacity to overcome adversity by responding in healthy and productive ways to successfully meet life's challenges. When we foster resilience, children are able to bounce back from stress, trauma, and even daily challenges.

Teaching these skills helps children to be braver, more curious, and better able to problem solve and cope. NCCSE supports fourteen North County School Districts, their students, staff and parents with resources, administrative guidance and training for parents and staff.
