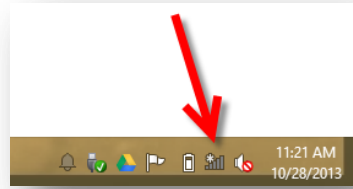
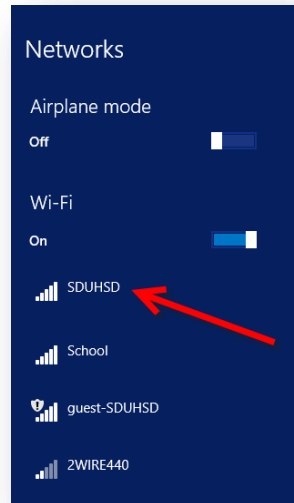


Connecting a Windows 8 Computer

1. Click on the Wi-Fi icon in the lower-right corner of the screen.

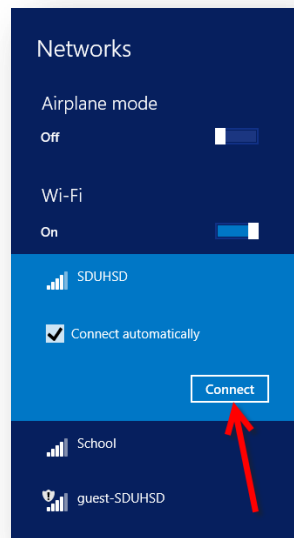


2. The “Networks” panel will open on the right side of the screen. Click on “SDUHSD”.



3. Click on “Connect”.

Pro tip: Make sure “Connect Automatically” is checked. If it is, you will not have to repeat these steps the next time you want to connect to the network.




4. Enter the user name and password you use to log into district computers.
